

It is had enough to find that there is no shaclute husiness or economic system to de assoure outsiness or economic system to uc-pend on. It is more upsetting to feel that there is no absolute law, even in the United States Constitution, that even "basic law" seems to be what people and Congress and courts make it from time to fime.

Amid-these shifting-constitutional sands, what foothold is there? Only this, if a mere layman may hazard an opinion on so great

That the sovereign people can get their will expressed through our constitutional forms, from age to age, through our three-branched government, slowly but surely, in matters seriously affecting the life of the nation. If necessary powers are not expressly stated in our basic law, surely they are implied. As George Washington recognized the Constitution was made for the people not the people for the Constitution, it is living organism, providing within itself for necessary changes to meet unforeseen con ditions. And thus we have lawful evolution

WAR BONUSES

Testifying in the Senate munitions in quiry, Eugene Grace, highly efficient head of the Bethlehem Steel-Corporation, involved himself in a strange logical contradiction. Admitting that he had received millions as abonus from the company's war profits, he said, in reply to a question about the demand for a soldiers' bonus:
