WASHINGTON, March 8 (AP)—The New Deal last night arranged to take advantage of a hydroelectric title under the Conservation Land Act to acquire 10,000 acres in the midwestern drought area—the start of a \$700,000-to-\$1,000,000-acre program.

Officials said the condemnation would enable the award of contracts to be made by the bureau of geological survey. As with the rest of the up to 7,000,000 acres, the land will be withdrawn from cultivation.

Senator Mitchell rose afterward, and replied to May's charges. "I do not charge politics when we come here. Politics and political parties are essential when we're at home being elected to office, but when we are in the legislature, we should assemble for the purpose of doing the greatest good for the greatest number of our fellow citizens.

"The best politics is to devote your honest labor to making legislation which will be beneficial to the majority of your fellowmen. I have had long experience when we come here. I have been elected to office by the people, and I should be able to call your attention to the trying times which I have faced during the past few years. I am sure that it is impossible upon him by the rigor of the office. The legislation and relief problems of the legislature are often wonder men, how any man can endure what he does. He is doing the best he can.

"Let us forget politics now. Let us settle down and put across the program we must have in our extraordinary session, and return to our homes," Senator Mitchell concluded.

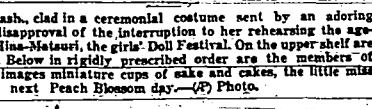

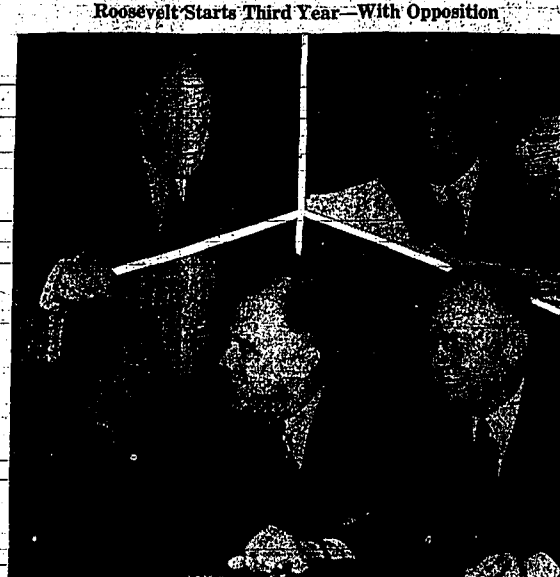
