



Some few bills have been actually passed but the total accomplishments of the regular ion are slight indeed. A liquor-bill is before the governor for signature, likewise tax delinquencies and mortgages. An auto drivers license law has been enacted and a lew other new laws have been placed on the statute books. But none of the major appropriations have been provided for and ordin-naily this feature of the work of a legislative session takes up about half of the entire sixty days. It is possible, therefore, that the special session will continue for two or three weeks. how it would have been possible to complete period. At a time when the American people are thinking more than ever before about "cco nomic security," it jolts a fellow to be told we've been ruined by thrift. If thrift ruined us once, it would ruin us again.

The Brookings Institution, a social re-search group, after carefully studying the depression, concludes that it was caused by saving too much money. It therefore caution the country against such folly now and here

It is very confusing. But analysis clear up the apparent absurdity. Everyone know that there were tens of millions of people who didn't save too much money, because they couldn't if they wanted to. The incomes of the majority remained rather low even during the boom. And the Brookings Insti-tution experts don't advise the humble majority not to save as conditions improve

The trouble was that the minority with good incomes saved too much. They took too much of their incomes and invested it, instead of spending it for goods and services ed-producing po consuming power.

The conclusion seems to be that the rich ould consume more, in order to make more work for the poor, so the latter can consume more and also save more for periods of unemployment and old age.

That's one way to help keep business on an even keel. Social and economic reform-ers, however, suggest various other ways. chief among them being heavier taxation of large incomes.

In 1933 alone Twin Falls and Jerome County growers received \$1,084,327.86 for their crop.

Producing the crop turned loose \$288,952.20 in wages in these two counties.

The sugar factory payroll while processing the crop was \$227,781.21.

A harvest of 8000 acres in the Twin Falls district would give the plant a 75 day run, assuming average yields as in the past.

Sufficient water is already assured on the South Side to produce a crop.

President George Cobley of the Idaho Beet Growers Association in a recent speech predicted a price to the grower of \$7.50 a ton for beets. Sugar factory estimates are slightly more conservative.

### Now

The leaf hopper threat seems to govern the situation. The government report was not wholly favorable. Frankly, the beet crop has experienced several bad production years. Other crops have had bad price years. Both mean a loss. Both could happen again. This signed statement makes no attempt to hide the truth.

### But

There are favorable factors. The new-U. S. improved Number One-resistant-seed-from th 1934 crop at Las Cruces, New Mexico, is the best so far developed. Ask the local entemology department, the sugar factory executives, or members of the local Beet Growers Association. They will give you the facts. Spring weather conditions could materially change the outlook.

### Yet

705 acres were harvested by 108 growers. Yields of 8 to 10 tons were not unusual from these fields although many had been neglected or practically abandoned.
