

No pledge of this kind, however, can be absolute. It depends not only on the Chief Executive, but also on Congress and on public opinion, directed but not created by demagogues. It depends most of all on what is back of all these other factors—business conditions. Economic forces push, in turn, public opinion, Congress and President. We might even add the judiciary.

If inflation comes, then, under the pres-

sure of public polition and emotion; what will be the real causes? It will come from what engineers would call the "stresses and strains" in our economic system that are not relieved in other ways.

Some of the strains that were cracking

relieved, but very serious ones remain. There is the strain of unemployment, presting upo strain of public finance trying to carry this unemployment load. There is the strain of supporting capitalization and debt frozen at inflated levels. There is the widespread at injusted and in the strain of trying to pay prosperity interest and utility rates, and in many cases prosperity prices and wages, with deflated in-

We shall have no peace, no case, no financial safety, till we restore the economic balance. Wa will not have a balance until we either finish deflating things of class reflate the things now deflated. If such har-mony is much longer delayed, there may be a big push to inflate everything.

"MONOPOLY CAPITALISM"

An interesting but irritating book is "The Economic Consequences of the New Deal" by Benjamin Stolberg and Warren Jay Vinton Almost anybody can find something in it to get sore about. Here's one-passage for instance, about capitalism with for instance, about capitalism, with exas perating assumptions:

"Monopoly capitalism—which is the phase of capitalism that America has now reached, is inexorably driven to make anti-social decisions. Its policies cannit help run counter to the interests of every social group except itself. Its decisions must be against the interests of labor, because business enterprise considers labor only an expense which eats into profits. Its decisions must be against the great middle classes, because it needs their savings for exploitation in speculative undertakings. Its decisions must be against the farmer, because its interests lie in beating down the general cost of living and of raw materials. Insect, the decisions of monopoly capitalism must be against all of us as consumers because its drive. For the highest possible price inevitably results in curtailed production."

If-capitalism ever-was so ruthle —or so stupid—surely it can no longer be so. Such a policy, generally practised or in-sisted on by capitalists, would destroy both industry and capitalism.




