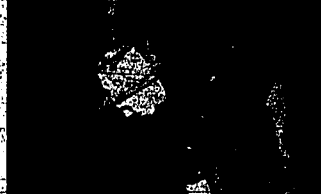

### 'Sandhogs' Blast Tunnel Under Hudson

NEW YORK, March 17 (AP)—Dynamiting, hammering and excavating through the 200-100 feet below the Hudson river, 700 men are fighting a winning battle against nature here daily as they inch an enormous cylindrical cast iron tube from Weohawken, N. J., to the heart of Manhattan.

men, who build the permanent structure out of huge iron rings inside the shield. Each iron ring is 2 1/2 feet wide. On the New York side, where there is more rock, they are sometimes advanced only the width of one ring in 24 hours. On the Manhattan side, they are pushed through much, as they are across the river, they close the front end of the steel cylinder, except for two small doors, and men force the entire cylinder through the muck with the aid of 28 huge jacks, each of which has a shooting capacity of 200 tons. When advancing through mud, however, they must evacuate all the water, which is done by hydrogen bubbles in blood.

Beneath the Hudson river, the "sandhog" is leading muck and broken rock to the surface. The muck is pumped, this \$100,000,000 tunnel will connect Weohawken, N. J., with midtown Manhattan.

Push Huge Steel Tubes To start the project, two holes, 100 feet in diameter and 80 feet deep, were bored in the ground at Weohawken, N. J., the other at the west end of 31st street in Manhattan. # New Rules For Contract Make Game Less Costly

### Fourteenth Trick

NEW YORK, March 16 (AP)—It will be possible under the new rules of contract bridge to take 14 tricks although there are only 13 in the deck. Ordinarily bids of more than seven are illegal, but if after a grand slam no trump contract is reached, an adversary should forfeit seven clubs, for instance, he can be compelled to make his bid sufficient, which would involve a bid of eight clubs.

### No Trump Trick Count

The no trump trick count is changed from an alternating 30-40 count, that is 30 for the first trick, 40 for the second, 30 for the third and 40 for the fourth and so on, to 40 for the first trick and 30 for each succeeding trick. This will make the game less costly for the player who is not making a contract. A vulnerable doubled set costs 200 for the first trick and 100 for each successive trick. The penalty of 50 points for each undertrick is retained.

### Double and Undertricks

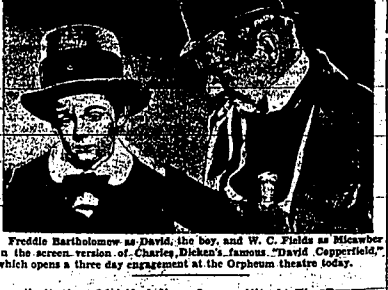

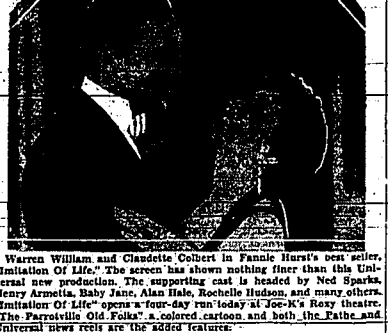

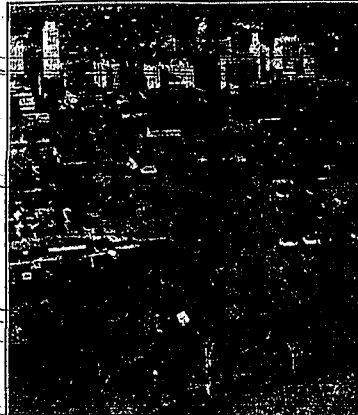

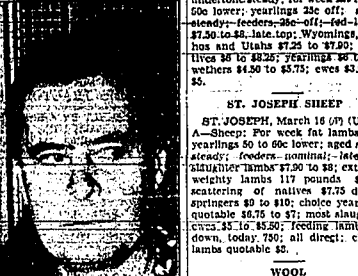

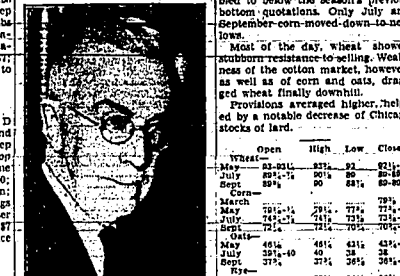
