

### FOUR YOUTHS

Shakespeare represented human life as a play with seven acts or ages, which was a poetical idea but not a scientific fact. Dr. A. Casyell Ellis, an American educator en-gaged in adult education, divides life into successive periods of youth. These youth periods are interesting in the

way they explain life and show its possi-bilities. First comes the new world of childbhood, lasting from infancy to about the age of twelve, during which we learn the use of our senses the elementary things of life, and our early school studies.

Then another youth dawns, and we are in the new world of adolescence, with growing interest in love, poetry, music, religion, morals, literature, history, science, and so on.

This continues until about twenty-one,

when there begins a third mental unfolding with its new set of interests—acquiring a home, rearing a family, helping with the world's work, becoming a part of the social world's wigh, becoming a part of the setal and economic order, getting ahead in business or profession. With these interests there awake new, powers to againete them. It is the longest period of all.

At fifty begins the fourth or philosophic youth, with more impersonal interests, more tendency to reflection and dispassionate

s we seem to live four different lives in a lifetime. And, the adult-educators main fain, the individual can always learn the new things belonging to his new youth as easily as he did when younger, and find them just as interesting.

### FEWER SUICIDES

One of the hopeful signs today is a decrease in the national suicide rate. One com-munity of about 1000,000 people reports a drop last year to 17.5 suicides per 100,000 opulation. The average for the previous nree years had been 21 per 100,000.

The total fatalities of this type during the

depression will never be known. The rate might be higher than any that could be fig-ured-from-positive-knowledge. The human loss from self-destruction is one of the most appulling effects of economic crisis. The rate is still distressingly high. If the 1934 figures quoted above could be assumed for the whole nation, it would mean about 22,000 suicides last year. An estimate covering the entire depression period might show a total at large as the United States Army. Much of it would not be necessarily traceable to the depres but economic distress would be the

leading cause. The change in trend of these figures sug-gests lessening pressure and returning con-




