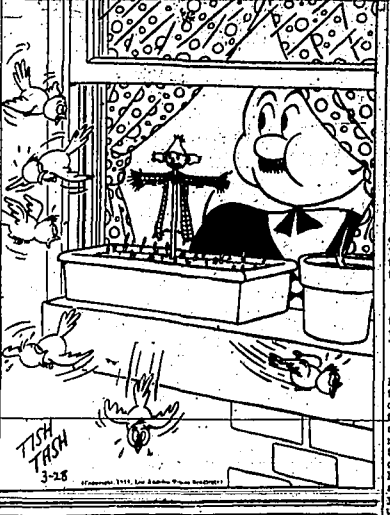

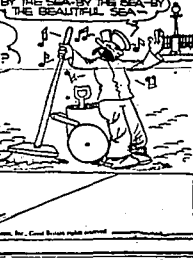

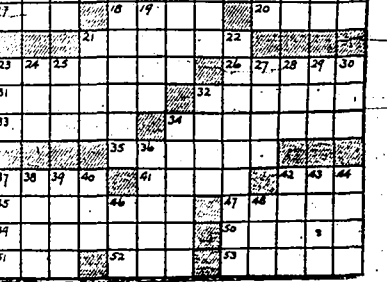

SETTLEMENT ENDS SUIT OVER TUNNEL

Canal Company and J. N. Molyneux Reach Agreement

J. N. Molyneux of Twin Falls, tunnel contractor, yesterday accepted a settlement of approximately \$33,000 claims for loss of profits caused by Twin Falls Canal company's alleged breach of three contracts for drilling drainage tunnels.

Announcement of the settlement brought a surprise termination to a second trial on one of Molyneux's claims that entered its third day in the district court here today. On this claim a district court jury in June, 1932, awarded Molyneux judgment for \$12,000. The canal company appealed and the supreme court ordered the new trial.

Terms of the settlement were not disclosed. Judge J. R. Bothwell, attorney for the canal company, said the settlement was "nominal," and R. P. Perry of counsel for Molyneux, said it was "satisfactory."

Under the settlement three suits against Molyneux had been dismissed. Contracts were annulled, and Judge Adam B. Barclay excused all district court jurors for the term "until further notice."

In the suit that was on trial for the second time, Molyneux asked for \$12,000 loss of profits. The canal company drove a tunnel to 1100.2 feet total length after consulting him on May 9, 1920, to leave the work when he had driven the tunnel 679.4 feet under his contract that was executed September 14, 1922.

In another suit, involving another tunnel contract, Molyneux asked for \$25,720.04 loss of profits on a contract entered into December 10, 1929, and broken, he said, by the canal company on August 13, 1930, after he had driven the bore 918.9 feet. The tunnel subsequently was driven to a total length of 2373 feet, he said.

On account of a third tunnel contract entered into December 10, 1929, Molyneux claimed \$23,223.23 loss of profits. His work was stopped August 1, 1930, after he had driven the tunnel 719.9 feet, he said, and the canal company continued the bore 539 feet farther.

Only two witnesses in support of Molyneux's claim had been called to the stand when the settlement brought the second trial to an abrupt end. They were Molyneux himself and John E. Hayes, Twin Falls engineer who was general manager for the canal company at the time the tunnel contracts were awarded to Molyneux. Among exhibits identified by the engineer was a wooden model of the tunnel, about eight inches high and approximately 12 feet long.

Registration will continue until 8 p. m. Saturday when the books will be closed.
