



#### CONFUSION WORSE CONFOUNDED

The placing in effect of the provisions of the sales tax law appears to be attended with about as many difficulties as were presented in the legislative effort which nded with its enactment

One or two points about the measure seem piain, Retail merchants are called upon to bollect the tax from their customers. Whole-isalers and manufacturers appear to be exempt. Those who deal in "services" are probably not included in the law's provisions-presumably doctors, lawyers and ac-countants will collect no tax. As to just where the newspapers stand nobody knows. where the newspapers stand no oogy knows. Printed matter may be a manufactured product or it may not. Newspaper subscriptions may fall under the head of "services" or they may not. Advertising, it appears, is definitely untarable.

#### WHEN FARMS BLOW AWAY

Those great dust storms, on the western rim of the plains that rise from the Missis-sippl to the Rockles, have come to be a national peril. Hundreds of millions of acres of semi-arid land threatens to become al together arid. Top soil that took thousands years to form is lifted and scattered all e way to the Atlantic. It fertilizes the land where it falls, though incidentally doing more damage than it is worth. It robs vast areas of fertility. A few more years of such winds and drouth as there have been lately would make a new strip of desert reaching from North Dakota to the Rio Grande. This is what happens when the prairie

sod is plowed up, and the silt is left with no adequate cover or binder, and there comes a series of dry years and high winds.

A series of rainy years, starting immed ately, would still save most of the damage region. Man can help with a general planting of tough grasses and more intelligent crop

At best, though, there will remain large areas comprising many thousand farms and ranches, already ruined—marginal land becomes submarginal.

Fortunately the government is already engaged in a program to move farmers from hopelessly unproductive districts to more promising ones, and can save much suffer-ing by rapid expansion of such work. Dising by rapid expansion of such work. Dis-tressed farmers will probably welcome such help from now on. Conservation begins to look more logical and necessary as Nature herself emphasizes the arguments of human conservationists. We may find ourselves in a new conservation movement far more ex-tensive than the original one of thirty years


