## PUBLIC HEALTH IN IDAHO

If as claimed by Dr. Charles R. Scott President of the State Medical Association, sewage from the State insane asylum at sevage front in the State insane sayium as Blackfoot in now passing into Snake River and being distributed throughout the water supply of the farmers and others who use the water, the fact constitutes a menace to public health which should be abated forthith no matter what the cost.
