

WASHINGTON, April 5—The higgest peace time appropriation in history—\$4,880,000,000—was voted President Roosevelt today to carry out already well defined plans designed to end the "dole" and put men to work.

COMMODITY-DOLLAR LEASES

We do not seem to be getting far along th road to the "commodity dollar," of which there was much talk a year or two ago, but there is some progress in that direction. Commodity clauses are frequently written real estato lease

It is specified that payment from time to time is to be made not in a fixed number of dollars agreed on beforehand, in the usual way, but in whatever number of dollars will at the time of payment, the food, cloth ing, transportation, housing, and so on, that the basic price would have bought at the time the lease was signed. Thus the number of cents per dollar, as it were, will go up or down with the general price index.

When the same principle is written into

a loan or mortgage agreement, as it is occa-sionally, it means that the lender will always get back the same buying power that he lent. This tendency naturally grows with the talk of inflation. The principle of such "hedg-ing" applies to the gradual inflation of ing" applies to the gradual inflation of national business expansion just as it does to runaway inflation such as might be caused by reckless issues of "printing press money."

Without those million troops in arms,




