#### WHICH IS BEST?

A recently announced "removal" of AAA
restrictions on this season's wheat crop production turns out to be in practice no modification at all of the restrictive program.

As perhaps was to be expected, the an d modification is so hedged about by onditions that extension agents through Idaho have with one accord advised wheat growers under contract with the federal government to give no heed to the "modifications" but to stick by the terms of their original contracts.

Intended scording to an AAA velloy sheet, "for the benefit of both consumers and producers and to offset reductions in and producers and to offset reductions in syled from possible recurrence of drouth in several of the major wheat producing states," the announced modifications require growers to make "additional reductions in "their 1986" plaintings corresponding to the increases in the 1985 plaintings," and postpone benefit payments, Idaho, is one of the states the AAA expects to increase this year's wheat crop under the contract modi-

The question that individual growers must decide for themselves is whether the AAA contract and benefit payments are worth more to them than the possibility of a short wheat crop that would enable them to sell an over-contract surplus at a high price next fall.

There is a question, too, whether a grower who has repudiated his AAA contract can get back into good standing and qualify for benefit payments later.

Questions like these are bound to arise

when the AAA crop control program en-counters a situation where the normal operation of supply and demand tends to outwelgh the advantages of government payments for reducing surpluses.

An overwhelming majority of the produc ers understand the situation exactly, and perhaps much better than those on the gov-ernment's end of the contract.

## A PROMINENT FIGURE PASSES

er in the country.

The newspaper career of Mr. Ochs commenced when as a boy of eight he became an in a Southern newspaper plant. From this humble beginning his career moved steadily forward. His first publishing venture comsisted in the purchase of a minor interest in the Chattanooga Times which he acquired with a cash outlay of two hundred and fifty dollars. Of Jewish ancestry, Mr. Ochs was by nature deeply spiritual, a fact reflected in his many charitable, religious and educa-tional interests. Only once did he hold public office. During his formative years he served for a term or two as a member of the public heard of Chattangors.

His career is noteworthy in many respects and in his passing newspaperdom loses one of its greatest disciples of clean and honor-able journalism.
