

THE ANTI-WAR MOVEMENT

During the last few weeks large numbers of college boys have stated they would not go to war unless the United States were invaded—that they would not fight on foreign soil even if their country participated in such a conflict.

Unquestionably this movement has de extent at institutions of higher learning. In theory its sponsors and adherents are sincere; in practice, however, the idea does not have a great deal to recom-mend it. During times of peace the fostering of such a movement is not difficult. But conditions change when a nation becomes in-volved in hostilities. Nationalistic fervor runs high and any scheme to retard enlistment would be viewed as unpatriotic. Besides, under the draft system every able-hodied dissenter would be forced to join the colors along with others anxious for a chance.

colors along with others anknows for a chance.

Abhorrent as war, is it calls for a unified, coordinated nation. A major conflict transcends all else in importance and once started, it should receive the wholehearted support of every citizen.

The anti-war students have furthered a truly idealistic scheme but one that will function best in peace time. Should war involve the United States these same students will play a gallant part no matter when or where their services are required.

MORE NATIONS OFF GOLD.

The little "gold bloc" of nations continues rinking. Relgium is forced off the gold standard after a brave struggle, and is devaluing her money. Switzerland is expected to follow soon. That will leave only France, Holland and Italy maintaining their gold currencies at the level established after their post-war deflation.

They, too, may yield. They will soon have yield if their gold continues draining away as it is doing now.

as it is doing now.

There are only-three important pools of gold left in the world. The largest of them is in America, the second in France and the third in England. Ours is greater than the other two together. And recent liners have been bringing new gold cargoes from France. It is concelvable that nearly all the free gold in the world, including much not ordinarily thought of as free, might flow into the vaults of our Federal Reserve system, or into a new Central Bank at Washington if we establish one. What then? The other nations, if we held onto that hoard, would go "off gold" for good.

They might get along with silver, or with unsecured banknotes representing that

unsecured banknotes representing that vague thing called "national credit." They might adopt some new unit of value; such as the "commodity dollar" that some of our economists have talked about, having stead economists have talked about, naving steady purchasing power but no intrinsic value like gold or silver.

And what good would our own mountain of money-gold be then? We might use it in




