Authority for the statement that Twin Falls county leads the State of Idaho in point of manufacturers' increased payrolls and production during the four-year period endand ing with nineteen hundred thirty-three is the al Department of Commerce census of manufacturers just made public.

During this period, throughout the statethe census indicates, the number of manufacturing establishments declined from five
hundred sixty-two in nineteen hundred
twenty-nine to three hundred forty-seven in
nineteen hundred thirty-three; the average number of wage earners dropped from fifteen thousand, six hundred forty-eight to seven thousand, six hundred eighty-two; wages fell from twenty-two million, four hundred fiftyone thousand, five hundred forty-five dollars to seven million, eighty-two thousand, one ndred ten dollars, and the value of products n ninety six million, three hund red fifty-two thousand, twenty-six dollars to my-five million, sixty-four thousand, five seventy-seven dollars.

Only three countles' manufacturers howed increases during the period, and win Falls county lead the list with the

The number of establishments in this county declined from thirty one in ninetees teen hundred thirty-four, but the number of teen numered thirty-four, but the number of wage earners increased from one hundred seventy-line to three hundred sixteen, wages advanced from two hundred forty-eight thquand, four hundred twenty-one to two hundred ninety-seven thousand, five hundred thirty-nine dollars and the value of products from three million, thirteen thousand, hundred eighty-eight to three million, six hundred thirteen thousand, eight hunized sixty-nine dollars.

Owners and managers of the establishments that survived the depression period thus far may perhaps best explain the true significance of these figures. There must be a moral in it somewhere.

Each nation seems, for the moment, to love the nation with which it makes a mutually-protective treaty. But all have fought and hated each other, and all will fight and hate each other again at the toss of a diplomat's hat or the firing of a careless gun.

the like. But in this form of property there is no close
connection between the possessions and the possessor.
Their qualities are entirely independent of him. The
second kind includes the perfection or shape; constitution and form of a much low, bits remperature, his tion and form of a man's body, his temperaments, hi tion and form of a man's body, his temperamenta, nos strength. But these he possesses merely as a "living being," and as a spiritual being "derives no profit from this kind of perfection." The third includes moral per-fection, the highest degree of excellency in man's char-acter. But moral principles are necessary-only—when man comes into contact with others; they concern his relation to this neighbor. They "give man no perfec-tion" in himself."

The true perfection, as Malmonides held, is that The true perfection, as Maimonides held, is that which attains the possession of the highest injellectual faculities. It not only gives the possessor human perfection, but it gives him immortality, and "on that account he is called man." "Examine." Maimonides asys, "the first three kinds of perfection. You will find if you possess them that they are not your property." But the last kind of perfection "is exclusively yours," and "your aim must therefore be to attain this fourth perfection that is yours alone."
