

### FAIR CHANCE FOR INDIANS

Congress lately enacted a law, the Wheeler-Howard act, that was intended to give the Indians self-government and economic in-dependence. The Indians themselves were delighted; it was what they have always wanted. They have voted to accept the plan by big majorities. The nation as a whole was pleased. It has always had a guilty conscience about driving the natives to degradation for lack of means and incentive to self-support.

The reform, though, seems in danger of being undone. Some of the tribes greatly need more land to become self-supporting and self-respecting. But the twelve million. five hundred thousand dollars voted for the ose is said to have been cut-down to half amount by the Budget Burcau, and then reduced to three million, two hundred seven ty-five thousand dollars by a House sub-com-mittee. The Indian commissioner who urged this new deal for the red man has been assailed. Varied interests in the regions where the tribes live are charged with trying to get more of their lands away from them.

Most Americans think the Indian has been robbed enough already, and that national demcy demands a fair chance for him now.
