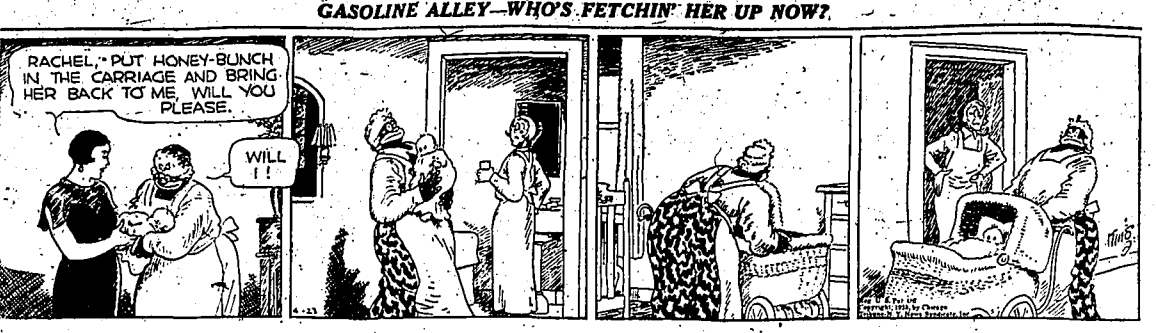

Under the present set-up, it was explained, Idaho Falls pays 12 cents, Twin Falls 13 cents, and Nampa 15 cents more than Greeley on shipments of potatoes and onions to eastern markets.
