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MERCHANTS ACCEPT TAX RULING WHILE OFFICIALS DISAGREE

Conflicting Views on Judge Rice's Opinion Expressed by Governor Ross and Attorney General Miller

BOISE, April 26 — While officials high in the councils of state government clashed tonight, merchants generally were handing down the interpretation accepted by Judge John C. Rice at Caldwell yesterday as a guide in collecting the 2 per cent retail sales tax.

While the attorney general, Bert H. Miller, was pointing to the Rice decision holding that the tax can be collected on "taxable sales," Governor Ross declared the state was going to collect on every \$100 sale, and Ben Diendorf, the governor's commissioner of finance and administrator of the act, issued a statement to that effect late today.

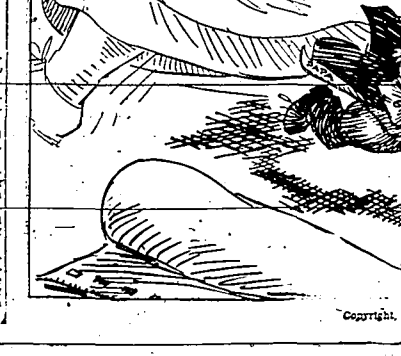

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CHILD AT BURLEY DROWNED IN TUB

14-Month-Old Son of H. B. Bodilly Meets Death in Tragic Accident

BURLEY, April 26.—Nile Bodilly, 14-month-old son and youngest of the children of Mr. and Mrs. H. B. Bodilly, was drowned Thursday afternoon when he fell headfirst into a tub of water on the porch at the family residence, seven miles southeast of here.

His two-year-old sister, Mary, carried word of the tragic accident to the child's mother and grandmother. The former had led the bathtub a moment before to assist the latter with sewing.

Water dripped from the little girl's hands and arms when she ran into the house and interrupted her mother's remembrance with the statement "Nile is in the water."

The child was carried to a physician's office here, after attempts to revive him at home failed, and two other physicians were called in to make further efforts at resuscitation, that proved futile.

Attorney General Eales

If you would improve your personal feeling of international good-will, know the best foods your neighbors of other countries have to offer. Garbo isn't Sweden's only contribution to the better things of life. Consider the smorgasbord of Sweden, these platters of hors d'oeuvres, those ravishing little appetizers, from which the American hostess has so generously borrowed ideas. Equally famous and delicious are the Norwegian specialties. As a suggestion, why not serve a Norwegian menu at your next luncheon or supper party?

When asked for the recipes, Mrs. Rutherford explained that they were favorites of both her grandmother and her mother, and were taken from "Norwegian Cook Book and

Tempting Dressings Made With Mayonnaise As Base

After You Have Foundation It's Simple to Have Variations

This is a salad dressing experiment. Number 2. Last week you learned the 12 variations for French Dressing. Employing mayonnaise dressing as the foundation, you can have 11 variations from this one base. Mix 1/4 teaspoon salt, 1/4 teaspoon pepper and 1/4 teaspoon paprika, and add 1/2 teaspoon prepared mustard. Then add eggs, beating well, gradually add the 2 cups salad oil, by the teaspoon at first, beating all the while, until 2 1/2 cups is used. Then add one tablespoon vinegar and beat 1/2 minute. Gradually add more oil, thinning as the mixture thickens, with the remaining vinegar until all of both is used, beating continuously. Following these directions, you will have the perfect mayonnaise.

Put Your Potatoes In "Prize" Class

Even though Idaho bakers are delicious in their natural form, it is nice everyone using them doesn't have the knowledge of this "stuffed potato" recipe, when preparing the vegetable. The following formula is for a family of four. If you want to serve them at the next luncheon meeting of your two-table neighborhood bridge club, just double the recipe.

Bake four well-shaped Idaho bakers in a fairly hot oven, until the outside is fairly crisp and tough. While these are baking, assemble 1 large Sweet, Spanish onion chopped fine (if green onions are used instead, include part of the green stem). Grate one cup of American cheese, saving about two tablespoons to put on top of the potatoes when they have been stuffed. Add 1 heaping teaspoon salt, two drops tobacco, a dash of Worcestershire sauce, 1 heaping teaspoon paprika, 1/2 teaspoon thyme, and 4 tablespoons butter.

When the potatoes are sufficiently done, split them along top side, remove the interior, being cautious to damage the jackets no more than necessary. Mash the potatoes with the mixture and add cream or milk to soften and blend. Refill jackets over the split mixture of butter or cracker crumbs, grated cheese, paprika, and small dots of bread. Replace in oven, regulating the oven so that the heat is more intense on top, and remove.

Spring Cookery Welcomes Fruit

Fruits as well as vegetables have tonic value when included in the spring menu. While bananas, a common fruit, are not identified strictly with this season of the year, they can be introduced from time to time as a cooked dessert novelty. When bananas are selected for cooking, the fruit, with an all-yellow skin should be chosen. Next time you are searching for a cooked dessert, tryripe Belgian bananas.

Allow 1/3 cup shortening, 1/2 cup sugar and 1/2 cup lemon juice stand together over hot water until melted. Arrange small size bananas peeled, in a shallow pan and cover with this sauce. Bake in a moderate oven for 30 minutes. Bake frequently. Another appealing fruit combination is glazed bananas with pineapple. Cut the bananas and pineapple slices in halves. Arrange in a shallow baking dish and sprinkle with sugar. Bake in a moderate oven for 10 minutes or until the sugar is melted.

Clark Directed to Issue Certificate to W. E. Taylor

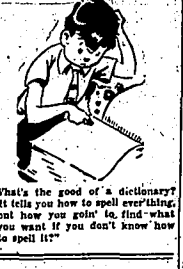
