A SOUND RULING

The Idaho sales tax law undergoes a revision at the hands of a district court judge which has much to recommend it.

While aiming to collect a sales tax of two

percent, the law, as heretofore administered, collected up to about six per cent on small purchases. The procedure was at all times indefensible but was accepted by merchants and business men generally as a necessary if evil feature of the law. From now on the practice will be different:

The decision is trailed in many quarters at step in the direction of a total elimination s step in the direction of a total elimination of the sales tax through the recently enacted referendum law. Petitions for a referendum on this law are telling circulated and opon this law are fleshy circulated and op-ponents of the tax profess to believe that the filling of the petitions will automatically suspend the law in that no referendum can be held, until the next general election. Whether or not this interpretation will be followed by the Supreme court it is difficult to see wherein the District court interpretation in any manner hastens the suspension of the sales tax law as a whole.

By and large there is no objection to tax as such. It makes a taxpayer of every citizen, for one thing. But it was total-by unnecessary in Idaho and never should ave been passed. There were other and better sources from which the needed revenue might have been taken without any increase in taxation whatever.

CHEERFUL FORECAST

"The greatest deliberate bodies in the world," says a Washington reporter, "appear to be deliberating more for the purpose of delay than delaying for the purpose of de-liberation."

This comment applies especially to the Senate. It has talked for three months and put through only one big piece of legislation—the work relief act. That delay has held back progress in public work and private work, and in the recovery that is possible when public and private forces pull together.

The House has been almost as dilatory. It




