It-is well to pause once in a while, and count our blessings. Europe has been struggl-ing with three great evils—economic depresalon, political revolutions and serious throats of war. We face only one of these perils. With all our argument about politics and our only really big trouble at pr is the depression, and we seem at last to be

Our international relations, while not all they might be, are incomparably better than those of Europe. And they are particularly our future lies. In this connection Dr. Ernes i-American matters, makes an apt statement:

"We have succeeded."-he says, "in smoothing out the difficulties and erased the straing that cause tension. We are establishing a beit of santly in this hemisphere, in telling contrast with the terror of impending war and intensified hates and nationalism in the Old World."

Here is a memorable phrase a belt of Sanity." May it long remain so.

### ARCTIC PIONEERING

European nations for conturies has been conquered by the Russians. This summer boats, manned by Soviet sailors, will go from Murmansk at the northwestern extremity of Russia, through the Arrite Sea, around through the Bering Sea to Viadivostok Four freighters will make the complete and perilous trip, two starting from Murmansk, two rided into four sections, each patrolled by wefful ice-breaker which will precede reighters through its section and then them over to the next patrol

There will be 78 other large ships in ser-vice within the Arctic Circle, covering short-er distances between points along the Soviet's northern seacoast.

Scientific expeditions will be there with airplanes and instruments, exploring little-known islands. One object is to test a theory that ice-free waters caused by the Gulf Stream Ife north of the 82nd and 83rd

What is it all about? Coal, nickel, zinc, copper, gold and oil have been discovered within the Arctic Circle. All of that wealth is worth getting at.

If the region can be made habitable, the

rest will be easy. Already methods of agri-culture and strains of plants suited to the Far North have been developed, and such work is still going on. Aviation lines already cover the Arctic region and link isolated explorers' camps. More are planned. Nine years ago the city of Murmansk had fewer than 9,000 inhabitants. Today it has 80,000 and they are served by waterworks, a power

Tanining plant.

It all makes exciting reading. The short water route to the Far East is in use, but not merely a trade route between pe and the Orient. Commerce, industry and agriculture have brought life to a for merly bleak region. The same thing ma hoon be done for the North American front-age on the Arctic Ocean, eastward from our own Cape Barrow in Alaska to Hudson's Bay, Canada already has railroads and steamship lines.
