

FREEDOM OF SPEECH

Secretary Ickes and Senator Borah, as faas the poles on many questions are in d-about one thing, the right of free speech and free assemblage. The other night Senator Borah appealed to the editors of the country and two days later Secretary Ickes appealed to the publishers to protect the right of free spaceh as jealous-ly as they protect the right of a free press. Freedom Secretary Ickes pointed out, is one and indivisible; "free economic enterprise, free political institutions and the free speech of which a free press is a part, are one and any of these fields without jeopardizing freedom in all the others.

Mr. Ickes's special concern was for the ght of free speech and free assemblage. He right of tree speech and tree assemblings. He finds the right of a free press on a firm fort-ing in this country, but the right of free as-semblings and free speech is denied in many places. Letting a soap-box orator short his mouth off strikes terror in the minds of many who would not think of curtailing the free-dom of the press. They forget that free dom of the press, they lorger that respect, free assemblage and a free press are of equal importance, "the three musketeers of our constitutional forces," in Mr. Ickes's phrase, which must "light shoulder to shoulder against overy threat of insidious for "."

foe."
In-this country we believe life would not be worth living without freedom. We would rather blunder and suffer from our mistakes and he free than be errorless and efficient to the "nth" degree without freedom. Still we have a human perversity that makes us want to limit the freedom of others—of want to limit the freedom of chiefs—of people we think dumb or crack-brained or subversive. Bins and prejudice are often given full rein because, while we have free-dom and cherish it, we do not have enough faith in it, or in ourselves, to let others




