Pessimism' is the fashion lately. A lot of Pessimism is the rasmon ratery. A row of the worst pessimists now were the most vocal optimists just before the collapse in 1929. They are probably as wrong as they ere then.

Most of the business indications lately are

good. Government observers, business observers and newspaper observers agree about that, and they can hardly be all wrong.

People have been fooled so often in the last

years that they have lost faith in any evidence of improvement, no matter how good it looks. They can't believe any more that

it looks. They can't believe any more that things can really get better.

This state of mind is natural, but unaclentific. The scientific fact is that booms and depressions have followed each other always, and that the economic cycle, however modified. fied by machinery and legislation, is still operating. Prosperity and adversity tend to follow each other like day and night. The boom couldn't last forever, despite what the irrational optimists were saying in 1928 and 1929, and neither can the depression last forever, despite what the irrational pessimists

nists on general principles are right nt least as often as pessimists. They are prob-ably right now. And at this stage of the business cycle, enough optimists acting to-gether could put prosperity over with a bang.
