



Twin Falls, probably in common with the rest of the country, is just now being deluged with chain letters. Bulky communications from persons never before heard of litter the desks of all and sundry. One gathers that desis of all and suncy. One gathers that those receiving such letters should make five copies of the same, address them to as many different friends and await results.

As to results, well, "This idea has been worked out successfully by a mathematician in hopes that it will bring us out of the departs of the delayers and of the delayers.

As a mere amusement, although an ex-pensive one, the scheme is not a bad one but as a means of ending the depression it is just about as feeble a gesture as could well be imagined. There are no short cuts on the road imagine... to prosperity.

CREDIT INFLATION

We may be set, after all, for the boom that Major Angas was prophesying last fall. At least we have still pilling up, in unprecedented plenty, the cheap credit on which he based his forecast. Money, as a business writer says, is working at "sweatshop rates." Here is easily lighted fuel for the fires of speculation.

The federal government has been tapping

the vast stores of idle credit piled up in the banks, and refinancing its war bonds at a saving of about one-third of the old interest rate. In its short-term financing it has been getting money lately as low as one-fourth of I per cent. This phase of the matter is fine, because it means a big saving for the public

treasury.

Another phase may or may not be so good.

"Call loans" in New York, for stock speculation, have gone lately to the same incredible low. With hundreds of millions of Wall Street noney available at one-fourth of 1 per cent, which merely pays bookkeeping expenses, there is strong incentive to use it in another orgy of stock gambling. It has begun to look lately as if such a movement is starting. People who have long been waiting to see

where "inflation" would break out may look here. The prospect of currency inflation has faded. Commodity inflation has not developed. It seems likely to be a credit specula-

tion, focussing first on securities.

Meanwhile, many observers are asking when such easy credit will get around to the people who need it to save their own property.




