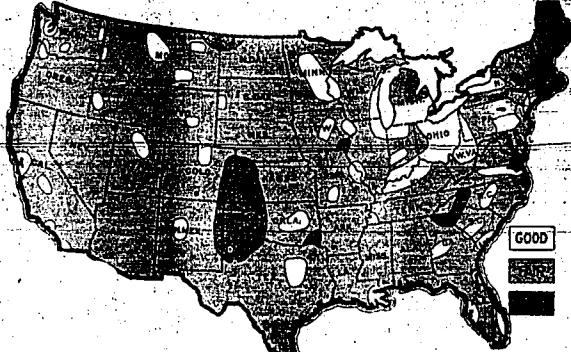

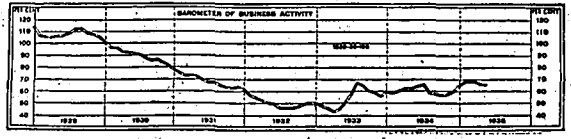

By JOHN P. BOUGHAN (Associated Press Market Editor) CHICAGO, June 3 (AP)—A menacing wet weather that has led to dangerous lateness of corn planting gave a strong upward lift to corn values today.

Particular anxiety among corn traders was aroused by drenching rains in Illinois, where it is estimated that only one-third of the 1935 corn crop has yet been planted.

Added to the upward momentum of the corn market were advices indicating that large areas of corn land here has been washed out by floods.

Emphasis by friends of higher prices for corn was put on the fact that the early planting season is now placed at 10,000,000 bushels against 43,500,000 a year ago.

Influenced by general relief that corn is planted before June 15, summaries to be issued tomorrow will show decided improvement of domestic wheat crop prospects, which are being planted before June 15.

Rice prices broke to a new low record for the season. Oats traders took their cue mainly from action of provisions reflected an unexpected decline of Chicago warehouse stocks.
