### SENATOR BORAH SPEAKS

Adherence to the Constitution of the United States as a necessary feature of any recovery programme was given place of first importance in an address delivered by Sen-

Importance in an address derivered by Sen-ator Borah Sunday evening.

So far from accepting the idea that the recent decision on N.R.A. has carried the country back to the "horse and buggy days" Senator Borah feels that a menace to pros-Senitor Boran reess that a menace to pros-perity has been removed and that the deci-sion is to be haled as a step in the direction of sound government in every sense of the

word.

There can be no question but what the power to change the Constitution lies neither with Congress or the President but belongs to the people as a whole but if the people desire to change this they may do so by the adoption of an amendment. In order to get

acopion of an amenament, in order to get the idea out into the open Senator Borah suggests its wording:

"The legislative power is hereby vested in the Congress of the United States and in the different executive departments which may be created from time to time."

Under such an amendment the Supreme Court would of course be shorn of every vestige of power over the actions of Con-gress, no matter what these might be.

Senator Borah makes it plain that the ldea of such an amendment is not to be taken seriously but points out that if the people desire the President to be legally empowered to exercise full and complete authority in to exercise full and complete authority in matters of government as well as of busi-ness of every sort, without responsibility or check of any kind, the way to bring this about would be by means of such an amend-

The proposal to submit an amendment to the national constitution empowering the federal government to regulate labor conditiona in industry regardises of sate lines is likely one of those hysterical inspirations that arise out of the thwarting of major policies, only to be abandoned on sober reflection.

That a power given government is a power always employed is astomatic. A governmental power lover unto its power always to congress it would be a power to regulate hours of labor and wages downward or upward. Once given to congress it would be a power superior to individuo contract or collective bargaining, and should be repugnant, in that respect, to organized labor itself. It would hardly be possible to word a workable and understandable amendment in terms flexible enough to preserve the liberty of action to which American labor has become accustomed and attil give congress the power sought.

The implied wartime powers of the national government are practically unrestrained. Almost any measure may be passed to protect the political esti-tence of the nation.
