TACOMA, Wash., June 21—Curt pleas of "guilty" were voiced here today by youthful Mr. and Mrs. Harmon M Waley in the \$200,000 George Weyerheuser abduction. Wa lev was quickly sentenced to 45 years in prison but the cour

of her case.

Welly refused to talk for himself but made a desperate last minute appeal in behalf of his 19-year-old wife, asserting she knew nothing of the abduction until the third day the 9-year-old there her was in Waley's hands.

Ontessions Ease Penalty.

A life sentence could have been imposed on Waley but Federal Judge E. E. Cushman presumably considered the confessions of the Waleys.

The sentence was imposed under the drastic "Lindbergh law."

Waley's plea also embraced a conspiracy count, which draw a two year sentence. The court ruled, however, that the sentence should run concurrently, making his total term 45 years. Federal officers said he would be eligible for parole after 15 years. Another indictment charging mail fraud and extortion was left pending against him, however.

Sorrowful Farewell

Two hours after their brief court appearance the Waleys bade a sorrowful farewell to each other in the office of United States Marshal A. J. Chitty. Then she was whisked back to the Olympic county jail to await her destiny in the making. Some of the inside story of the government's operations to solve the case were revealed by the only witness at the court hearing, E. J. Connelley, a department of justice agent.

The 24-year-old former convict refused to speak for himself when invited to do so by Judge Cushman.

Speaks Only For Wife

"All I have to say is for my wife." Waley told the court "Maybe you won't be here when her case is discussed," said the judge.

"Japan was a hermit nation, going her

The union went to court in behalf of "peaceful
picketing," which is a well established right, recognited by nearly all fair-minded people. But peaceful
picketing as the public understands, it is the right
of attriking EMPLOYES to picket the-piace, with
placeros if they like, calling attention to the sirtle,
saking the public not to patronize the place, asking
non-atriking employes not to work, or saking attribpreaters not to work. There can be no proper objection to this. It really is right and should be upheld.

But the circumstances at the Bridat Veil Lumber
company were entirely different. Only a handful of
the employes struck. More than 50 per cent stayed
right to tay that there was a strike at all. And most
if not all of the pickets were not employee of the
full, probably never had been. They came out from
Portland, borning into a situation that concerned
them only indirectly if at all. And so far from being
peaceful, some of the pickets, perhaps without orders
from the union in Portland, attacked a truck driver,
hit him on the head with a metal bar, threatened
to kill him the next time and tipped his truck over
a bank; this according to his sworn testimony in
court at the hearing. The men were union buttons,

'Under these circumstances there was nothing for the Portland judge to do except to hold that the sheriff and state police had a right to step in and maintain order. It was not a case where the "Peaceful picketing," 'principle could fairly be invoked. The decision is a setback for violence in labor disputes. It would be helpful to labor if labor would abandon it. There may be temporary advantages to be won by terrorism but it slaways reacts against those who practice it, whether they are employers, labor unions, European dictators, the Japanese army, or what have you.

Warren W. Finney, wealthy Kanasa banker, sent a builet crashing through his brain rather than serve a prison term for having engaged in eriminal banking practices. The suicide is the tragic attermath of the million dollar bond forgery scandal which rocked Kanasa two years ago. Whether the elder Pinney was privy to it or not the scrutiny which it brought upon his banks disclosed the frauddient transactions which resulted in his conviction.
