

#### CONSTRUCTIVE FINANCING

Apparently industrialists have decided that the securities act of 1933, however un that the securities act of 1995, nowever un-welcome, doesn't necessarily blight business after all. There was a big rush to register new security issues before the end of Jun-tive last day on which corporations could file statements as of December 31. The total of new securities thus filed was five hundred sixty five million dollars for June and one billion two hundred forty-five million dollars for the first six months of this year.

This record, observes the New York Times was viewed by financial authorities as mark ing an important development in business recovery. "The extent to which offerings are being made is considered evidence of a definite re-opening of the capital markets, and it is felt that other large issues, chiefly to provide working capital, will soon be of-

fered."

It was announced recently by the Machinery and Allied Products Institute that industrial requirements for new machinery and factory expansion now would speed re-covery and the public will be glad to hear of more such financing. It has no relation to the crazy financial bubble of 1928-9. That was destructive; this is constructive.

WIDENING THE HIGHWAY

Observers of Idaho's highway accident problem feel that one of the most dangerous factors is the narrowness of highways in heavily settled districts such as Twin Falls county. They point out that most of the serious accidents are the result of cars losing the road or sideswiping in passing, and that large trucks and busses, though almost al-ways carefully driven, leave a dangerously small portion of the road for the use of other

For this reason all those interested in the safety of the roads greet with thankfulness and hope the proposal to widen highway 30 from eighteen feet to thirty throughout Twin Falls county.

The state is begin-ning to do its part in improving the quality of driving. It is only fair that the highway districts do their part in improving the quality of the roads.

RANTING

The roating of a lawyer is often in proportion to the weakness of his case. And speaking in general, the more noise, the less fact and logic.

#### \$2.80 PER PERSON
