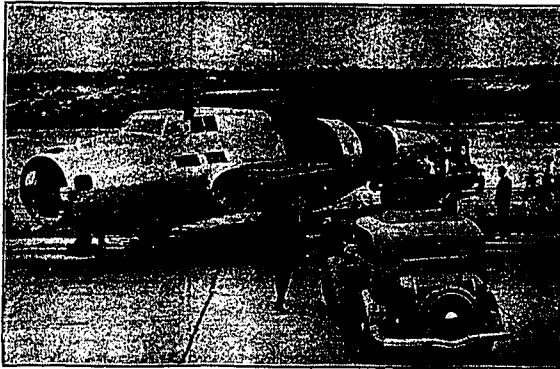

Democratic Committee Gets Reports of Declining Popularity

WASHINGTON, July 11 (AP)—Reports that the Roosevelt administration's popularity has declined "appreciably" in parts of New York state and New England since the supreme court's NRA decision have reached headquarters of the Democratic national committee.

This information came from W. Forbes Morgan, secretary of the committee, who said:

"West of the Hudson river the president's popularity is as strong as ever. Some of the people in the northeast, however, are a bit confused on the issues. Of course he is basically as strong as ever throughout the country."

Asked to explain the situation in the northeast, Morgan said "most of our enemies are located there and they have been going at us." Besides the NRA decision, the textile situation and the controversy over the processing tax in New England are involved in the campaign of attack, Morgan said.

Maps Campaign
The secretary, who helps keep tab on public sentiment for the committee, disclosed that he had discussed the matter "very briefly" with President Roosevelt; this week in a conference devoted to many topics.

Asked what the Democrats intend to do about the attacks in the northeast, Morgan said:

"We are going to open up in time; probably after the adjournment of congress."

The president's son, James, of Boston, may take a leading hand in efforts to recover strength in the northeast.

The Democratic party has a deficit of about \$370,000 and Morgan predicted it would be wiped out by September 1; that date is the deadline for state organizations to fill their quotas assigned several months ago. Morgan said that after the elimination of the deficit no extensive money raising efforts will be made until after the national convention. He added that the three localities now most prominently mentioned for the 1936 convention are San Francisco, Chicago and Atlantic City.

Cheese-Like Fuel Operates Ordinary Gasoline Engine

NEW YORK, July 11 (AP)—Gasoline solidified to look like a piece of cheese was used successfully to run an ordinary gasoline engine in tests announced by the director of an aeronautics school, New York university.

The tests bring close to practicability an eight year search for a safety gasoline, something non-explosive, which will do the same work as liquid gasoline.

In the simple test engine the hard gasoline was more efficient than ordinary gasoline, under exactly the same running conditions. This was announced only as a good sign, and not as a prediction.

Non-Explosive
The new stuff will not explode. A piece of it the size of a butter pat was stuck on the end of a knife. A lighted match was held close, its flame touching, nothing happened.

When the flame made actual contact, the hard gas lighted as quickly and easily as a sheet of paper. It burned as brightly. But, was extinguished more easily. One good puff of breath blew out the flame.

The tests were made under direction of Dr. Alexander Klemin, director of the school. They were conducted by A. N. Troshkin.

The hard gasoline was invented by Adolph Prussan of New York. The cheese like stuff that worked so well is the latest in a series of more than 900 batches of hydrocarbons which he has hardened in the search for an efficient, hard gasoline.

The test engine is a four-cycle, compression ratio, 32 to 1; bore 3 1/2 inches; stroke 3 1/2 inches.

The cheese gasoline was enclosed in a jacket, heated by the engine exhaust. The exhaust was pre-heated by operating the engine first with ordinary gasoline. A special carburetor was used for the solid gas.

SUPPORT PLEDGED TO FARM PROGRAM

Colorado Conference Goes on Record for New Deal Policies

FORT COLLINS, Colo., July 11 (AP)—The new deal's agricultural recovery program and its leaders were pledged support of western farmers here yesterday when the regional conference of the American farm bureau federations voted resolutions praising the administration's farm program.

The resolutions were adopted at the end of a three-day conference of federation representatives of 11 western states, Colorado, Wyoming, New Mexico, Montana, Utah, Arizona, Nevada, Idaho, Washington, Oregon, and California.

H. J. King, of Laramie, Wyoming, was nominated as national director of the federation.

"Arraigns" Vested Interests

In a fiery closing address, President Edward A. O'Neal of the federation charged that "powerful vested interests in the nation are strongly organized to sweep aside the achievements of a generation for agriculture."

He asserted that "this threat is a challenge to intelligent farmers in America to band together and fight to protect their own interests."

Other resolutions unanimously passed recommended:

That the investment per person employed not be applied to limit desirable permanent projects in federal recovery expenditures.

Passage of the Warren potato bill. Removal of the \$600,000 acre limitation for grazing districts.

Inclusion of wool and mohair and price posting in the marketing agreement provisions of the AAA.

Aid in Weed Control

Federal research and aid to states in weed control.

That western governors work for adequate seed inspection, including seed laboratories and field inspection to insure quality weed-free seed.

Enactment of laws to make weed control effective and programs to make farmers more "weed conscious."

Establishment of inland waterway facilities to shippers.

Support of the farm credit administration. Secretary of Agriculture Wallace and the AAA administrator, Chester Davis.

Inauguration of a program of education on the administration's agricultural recovery program.

Establishment of operating unit earning power principle to permit the farm credit administration to serve farmers more effectively.

Unlimited use of highways in distributing commodities.

Launching of a vigorous membership campaign.

CASSIA COLLECTIONS OF TAXES INCREASE

BURLEY, July 11—Taxes collected in the office of W. R. Stearns, Cassia county tax collector, during the month of June, 1938, totaled \$171,000, compared with \$165,000 a year ago, or an increase of \$6,000, according to figures released Thursday morning of these amounts \$47,000 was collected on delinquent taxes as against \$31,000 the same month in 1936, while current collections were \$100,000 less than the preceding year.

Aggregate tax collections, both current and delinquent, during the first six months of 1938 were \$307,000 compared with \$282,000 for the same period 1937. Up to July 1 of this year 70 per cent of all current taxes entered on the 1935-year property tax rolls had been collected. President's Tax Program Called New Emphasis In Federal Policies

By DON JOSEPH NEW YORK (AP)—The President's intention of "encouraging a wider distribution of wealth" through greater taxation in economic programs is saying, a historical change of emphasis in federal policies.

Although redistribution of wealth in some measure is inherent in any progressive taxation principle, they say that previous taxation programs using this method have emphasized revenue as the chief object.

Speaking of his program, and the benefits from the application of such a philosophy of taxation, President Roosevelt says: "By so doing, we shall progressively lighten the tax burden of the average taxpayer, and, incidentally, assist in our approach to a balanced budget."

Civil War Income Taxes Progressive taxation in the past principally developed on the theory of applying the burden where it could be best borne and where the greatest social benefits accrued.

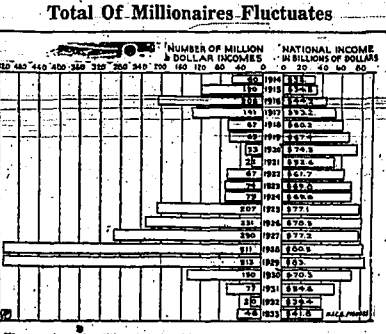

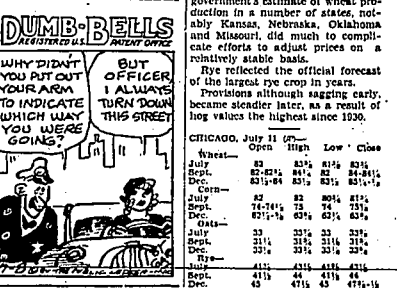
