AMERICA KEEPS OUT Haile Selassie, emperor of Ethiopia and reputed descendant of King Solomon, needs his legendary wisdom now as he faces the power of Mussolini, determined to carve a modern Roman Empire. Ethiopians are brave men, but the odds are very great. One of the oldest independent nations in the world seems doomed.

In his anxiety Haile Selassie, despairing of action by the League of Nations, appeals Washington for intervention.

Here, as everywhere else except in London

he finds courteous refusal. The British govhe finds courteous refusal. The British government might interven, by force if necessary, to protect her own great African interests. But the United States government has had enough experience with entanglements in foreign wars to last for a long time. We cannot step in to save China from Japan, and we cannot step in to save China from Japan, and we cannot step in to save Ethiopia from Italy. Not one American citizen

in 100 would sanction such action. For the present and the immediate future, at least, we devote our energies to our own domestic problems and try to work out our own des-

When the world is really ready for international peace and truly concerted action, it will probably find America ready for effective co-operation. But that time is not now in sight.

LOBBYING

The investigations of lobbying in both the Senate and the House will bring that insti-tution an even brighter spotlight before the

public than it has previously occupied.

So long as the lobbies confine themselves to their function of placing pertinent facts and arguments before the congressmen, they and arguments before the congressmen, they are not only harmless but a valuable adjunct to Congress and of the greatest usefulness to the American people. But there are grave suspicious that these groups of men, employed by both private interests and the administration for the purpose of furthering or defeating certain legislation, are guilty of using questionable methods.

These men are sent to the Capitol with These men are sent to the Capitol with instructions to achieve a certain result, and, undoubtedly, with a sincere belief in the justice of their cause. It is only too likely that when it seems straightforward argument may fail, they will resort to other methods, such as intimidation, deception, high pressure, and perhaps even bribery.

And be it noted that the administration has much more powerful and subtle weapons than does private industry, as well as an immunity from punishment for their use.; However, if it be found necessary to pass

laws to curb the activities of lobbyists, Congress must be careful not to destroy the right of the people to bring their arguments freely before their representatives in Washington. It will be no easy task to rule out dishonorable lobbying without destroying this esntial free contact.

WAR CHILDREN GROWN UP Prophecies are not always heeded at the Prophecies are not always needed at the time they are made. Such a prophecy was made in 1928 to John Palmer Gavit, a vice president of Survey Associates and one of the editors of the monthly magazine, Survey Graphic. He was in Germany. Impressed by the strange quiet of German children whom he saw playing in parks and village streets, he asked a famous German psychiatrist about them. The psychiatrist explained:

"They bear the marks of inadequate prenatal metabolism of their mothers during the 'starvation period' of the War and the inflation; of insufficient nourishment for themselves; and of the anxiety, uncertainty, hate and fear sat-urating their home atmosphere."

Then came the doctor's prophecy, which seemed to Mr. Gavit at the time to be an xaggeration, but which has already been

That very unnatural quiet you have noticed is the sign of a repression which will have its revenge. I fear that this rising generation of Germans may become a nuisance in the world. And you must remember that all nations which participated in the Warlalo have children more or less subjected to the same kind of conditions. Ten years from now they will be facing each other as grown people. It will take a long, long time in the world to liquidate these things."
