BAR HITS MOVES TO SAP CONSTITUTION

Lawyers' Convention Aims Criticism at New Deal Agencies

LOS ANGELES, July 19 (AP)—The bar of the United States for such legal instruments as the NIRA and the AAA, the American Bar Association, met in session here today to discuss changes in the essential lines of the constitution by process of correction of its text.

Almost simultaneously a noted constitutional lawyer, James M. Beck, former United States solicitor general, was put forward as a "dark horse" candidate for president of the association, but was beaten by William Lynt Ransom of New York in spirited balloting.

Although the critical resolutions did not mention the new deal by name it said: "If the legislative, executive, executive and judicial branches are to be changed, let it be by constitutional amendment, so that the people will know on what issue they are voting."

AMERICAN DENIED SOVIET SCHOOLING

MOSCOW, July 19 (AP)—Two hundred American students who came all the way to Russia to attend the summer school session at Moscow university and then found the course cancelled held mass meetings tonight at a downtown hotel to decide what action to take.

The students, visibly disappointed at the eleven-hour cancellation of the session, were divided into two factions.

A minority expressed themselves as dissatisfied with the official explanation that the courses were cancelled because the teaching staff was unable to find time to attend.

Many of the students complained to the American embassy in the belief that the cancellation was due to pressure from the United States.

Vitamin D Supplied By Mechanism At Buhl Plant

Renowned Chef Tells How To Make An Art of Salads

One day recently Jacques Gessell, of the National Hotel Management Association, got to talking of salads and what he had to say was so good that he is improving the salads of Mr. American Homeowner. Demonstrating his skill, he cautioned the women in his audience to take plenty of time in making a salad and added, "Don't be tinkly about using your fingers."

He encouraged them to make the time salads such as those which bring renown to great hotels. "But you can't do anything with a knife and fork," he declared, holding the ingredients between thumb and forefinger while placing them in a salad working quickly so that they would lose none of their crispness.

"Give your salads a hair," he coaxed. By "hair" he means darning to use novel combinations with the same abandon as one has done colors in weaving apparel this season. He favors tomatoes with orange, cucumber and grapefruit, hard-cooked eggs with alligator pears, and such.

The "recall" and "carry" salad is an alligator pear filled with shrimp or crabmeat and served with French Dressing, according to Gessell. A

heat in this first step in the process is necessary to secure a good finished product.

The next step is the removal of dirt of the water. This is done by a large air-tight copper vessel, holding eight or nine thousand pounds of milk which are called "vacuum pans" by potting purists. A large part of the air is taken out of these pans so that the water of the milk will evaporate into steam at a low temperature. Heat is applied by putting steam through copper pipes, which are coiled about the inside of the pans. The milk is kept in the pans until the proper amount of water has been taken out to make the evaporator into steam at a low temperature. The milk is then ready for canning, labeling and carrying to the refrigerator to being sent to markets all over the world.
