TERRE HAUTE, Ind., July 22 — A sudden general strike brought virtually complete business paralysis to Terre Haute tonight, stopped the normal flow of food and other necessities to its 66,000 inhabitants and forced strict military rule by nearly 2,000 national guardsmen.

Doors of almost every retail establishment swung shut as roving bands of strikers canvassed the city, urging a complete cessation of business. Groceries, ice, gasoline and other necessities could not be bought. The Chamber of Commerce, while declining to estimate how many stores had closed, estimated the loss to business in the first day of the strike at \$200,000.

### EXTREMES IN LIVING STANDARDS

The Federal Real Property Inventory con ducted in a metropolitan area in one of the big industrial sections reveals some unpleas-ant contrasts in living standards. In the area studied seven hundred eight

In the area studed seven nuncred eight familles. light with gas; five thousand seven hundred two light with kerosene or gasoline; seventy nine thousand two hundred sixty six heat with stoves only. There are in that same large area fourteen thousand two hundred sixty three families having more than one motor car.

more than one motor car.
There are in the region surveyed, three
thousand eight hundred thirty one homes
valued at more than twenty thousand dollars
and eight thousand eight hundred three inhabited units unfit for living — wretched
dwellings lacking running water and decent

dwellings lacking running water and decent sanitary equipment.

—According to the director of the survey, the living standard for the whole district is the highest in the country, while there are "spole here and there which have the lowest possible standard—sometimes impossible." If our American enterprise is all that we believe it is, these impossible spots should not be tolerated much longer. The country needs not fewer twenty thousand dollar homes but more two thousand dollar to five homes but more two thousand dollar to five nomes but more two thousand dollar to five thousand dollar homes with modest but de-cently adequate heating, lighting and plumb-ing equipment. When we discover the right way to go about this national improvement we may find that we have solved for many years to come some of our most troublesome mass production, overproduction and employment problems.

The epidemic of car-window smashing that has afflicted Twin Falls over the weekend seems to be more in the nature of senseless vandalism than theft. The trifles

ported to have been stolen amount to little beside the value of the destroyed glass. Nearly everyone would much rather have his property actually stolen than maliciously ruined. He would rather feel that someone, even though quite undeserving, is getting some benefit from his lost property, than know that it was destroyed merely for the sake of destruction.

And the anger felt by Twin Falls citizens is not lessened by the fact that two of the victims of the episode are guests from out of town, who will undoubtedly go home with

unkind thoughts of this city.

It is to be hoped that the responsibility for the crimes will be definitely fixed on the culprits who committed them, and that the law will take its course with an eye single to justice.






