



HIGHWAY IMPROVEMENT

Apparently the proposal to widen High-way 30 through Twin Falls county has fallen afoul of the PWA's provision against the expense of much money for materials per man employed. It has been suggested that this county seek to improve the farm-marke roads as an alternative.

roads as an alternative.
It is apparent, however, that market roads
in Twin Falls county are with few exceptions in fairly good condition, and the highway is dangerously inadequate for the traffic
it must bear. Not only is the surfaced part of the highway altogether too narrow, but the shoulders are mere strips, little, rough, and treacherous. The narrowness of the highway would not be in such immediate need

way would not be in such immediate need of attention if there were an appreciable margin of safety left at the sides.

It is in the province of highway experts to decide to what extent the shoulders of the highway can be widened without requiring the purchase of additional right of way, and how much the surface can be improved with-out the purchase of too much material to meet PWA requirements. But even without expert advice, a layman can be sure that it is possible to alleviate the situation to some

There are undoubtedly rules-of-thumb to determine how much right of way is needed for a highway of a certain width, and it may be that such rules indicate that the highway cannot be widened without additional land But Twin Falls county must not be satisfied with engineering from a distance—it is necessary to have a competent highway engineer on the spot, show him the situation and the importance of the proposed improve-ment, and see if he is not able to make constructive suggestions.

PRIVATE CHARITY

Gifts to charity have been rising rather surprisingly. In the first six months of the present year they totaled twenty eight million one hundred thirty three thousand two hundred twenty six dollars, an increase of one hundred four and sixty four one hundredths per cent over the same period two years ago. A fund-raising concern states that there had been a steady decline in giv-ing since 1929. The slump was halted last year, and the upward swing observed then is continuing.

This situation is interesting. It suggests that the public has not dropped its belief in private philanthropy in favor of public doles. It suggests also an increasing sense of res-

It suggests also an increasing sense of responsibility toward philanthropic causes, inducing people to share what they have, even if it is not so much as they used to have.

Obviously people are not keen about being taxed much further for relief purposes. Yet they recognize certain needs and try to meet them through personal contributions to community shorts and other furths. munity chests and other funds.
