

#### A ONE-BUILDING CITY

A St. Louis architect, Henri Rusch, for-merly city engineer, has the grandest of all building schemes, which he offers the government as "his contribution to a troubled ernment as "his contribution to a troubled world." It would cost two hundred thirty three million dollars and would accommodate two hundred fifty thousand people, provid-ing in a single unit and under one roof all residential commercial and industrial facil-

In this gigantic structure, covering several In this gigantic structure, covering several city blocks and rising to a height of 196 stories, there would be a "world mart in which would be sold everything the world produces, housed in a building of colossal proportions which in itself would attract the traveling visitors of other countries."

It would attract visitors, all right, whether occupied or vacant. What it would do to the two hundred fifty thousand human beings supposed to. live, work and play in such an ant-hill is another question. Its construction would make work and distribute money, but it is hard to imagine even a generous government taking it up either as a housing project or a potential museum for the exhibition of American civilization.

The whole tendency in this country lately.

The whole tendency in this country lately, as our population approaches a standstill and our appreciation of real living develops, is for cities to flatten down and spread out, enabling people to lead-more natural and wholesome lives.

### TRIAL PUBLICITY

The American Bar Association has turned a critical eye upon court procedure and legal ethics, apparently with the intention of correcting current abuses. Its own committee on co-operation between the press and the bar, in a recent report, criticizes particularly the conduct of the Bruno Hauptmann trial.

"To treat a simple trial as a public show is to cheapen life itself by causing people generally to undervalue the life of the criminal, and to increase the morbid desire of sensation seekers."

The report recommends that a committee be established on the relations between the press and bar, consisting of a small number press and bar, consisting of a small number of lawyers of outstanding ability, and representatives of the Associated Press, the Interfactional News Service and the United Press, together, if desired, with representatives of the National and Columbia Broadcasting Companies, to make a nation-wide survey of conditions surrounding the publicity given to criminal trials. to criminal trials.

This is no easy problem to tackle, but the sooner all concerned get at it the better. A proper amount of publicity is essential for the preservation of the rights of accused persons and the information of the public. But the public has no right to demand that a trial be served up as a sensational and emotional feast to satisfy morbid curiosity. There has been a wave of reaction against such inexcusable sideshows as accompanied the Hauptmann trial. The public as well as the Bar Associations share in this feeling of shame and disgust. If press, bar and courts act now to prevent a similar performance in the future they will find the majority of the public with then.






