### FIRE PREVENTION

The Forest service avoids closing the Saw-tooth and Challis national forests to campers, even in seasons when the fire hazard is considerable. This is partly because the nature of the territory makes uncontrollable fires less likely than in other districts, and partly because the Forest service is reluctant to deprive the people of this foremost region for outings in Idaho. But in return the rangers ask that camp-

ers use the greatest caution, and have recenters use the greatest caution, and have recently requested that in Stanley Basin and the
Challis forest all campers be equipped with
shovel, axe, and water bucket. Such equipment would be necessary in the case of a
camp-fire that breaks lose, and would enable an outing-party to nip a fire in the bud
in case of the discovery of the beginning of
a conflagration.

# **FUTILE PROTESTS**

Reports from Germany of continued ac-tion against Jews, veterans, and Catholics should disillusion those who believed that protests from foreign countries were actual-

protests from foreign countries were actually influencing Germany's internal policy. After a growing wave of protest over the world, the Nazi government made a gesture. for the benefit of foreigners, of suppressing the criticized movement. But the persecution goes on. And it will go on until the campaign has run its natural course apparent; it is already obbing. Hitler's gesture, no doubt timed to meet the crest of the feeling against "state enemies" in Germany, may deceive protesting groups into believing their protests were effective, and they may, when next an occasion offers, go on involving their governments in diplomatic disputes and international complications. national complications.

The friction thus caused is not serious yet, but over a period of time it may add up to a dangerous total.

# A THREAT TO LIBERTY

Opposing the military disaffection bill now pending in the House of Representa-tives, Congressmen Maverick of Texas and Kvale of Minnesota describe it as a "direct

Kwale of Minnesota describe it as a "direct and wanton assault on the freedom of the press and free speech."

The measure, passed by the Senate and approved by the House military committee is more drastic than the E-pionage Act in force during the World War. The bill reads,

"Whoever advises, counsels, urges, or solicits any member of the military or naval forces of the United States, including the reserves thereof, to disoby the laws or regulations governing such military or naval forces, or whoever publishes or distributes any book, pamphlet, paper, print, article, letter, or other writing which advises, counsels, urges, or solicits any member of such military or naval forces of the United States to disobey the laws or regulations governing such military or naval forces, shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$1,000 or by imprisonment of not more than two years, or both."

# RAILWAY FARES

The public welcomes, and perhaps the rall-roads themselves should welcome, the examroun report to the Interstate Commerce Commission on the subject of passenger fares. The rate now throughout the country is given as 3.6 cents per passenger mile. The report, made after an extensive inquiry, suggests a flat 2 cents for coaches and 3 cents for Pullmans.

Exact appraisal of the proposed rates is a matter for experts. But almost anyone who travels on railroads, or observes railroad travel from the outside, will probably agree in principle, with the report.

"A maximum fare basis, one way and round trip," it says, "for general application, of 2 cents per mile in conches and 3 cents per mile in Pullmans, would be most likely to lessen the transportation burden of the rallroads and to harmoniew with present-day conomic conditions, with consequent fuller assurance to the railroads of realizing a fair return on their investments."
