

PROCESSING TAXES

Suits brought by processors against the AAA taxes reveal an interesting situation, which is probably about the same whether the product is flour or pork or anything else. Take pork, for example. We quote from stockyards publication:

"The government processing tax is paid by the packer and not by the farmer. Today, for instance, hogs broke into a new high at \$10.75. Processing tax paid by the packer was \$2.25 a hundred-selfall. The farmer gets fall value—\$10.75. The packer pays the government \$2.25, the cost of the hop being \$13 to the packer and the public This is why pork products are so high. The government processing tax is always paid by the killer and costs the public that much in addition to the live hog quoted price."

Obviously the processor pays the tax only Obviously the processor pays the tax only in a bookeeping sense. Actually it is paid-by the public. It is odd if anybody ever expected anything oles. The consumer is fortunate in a given case if he merely pays through the processor, to the farmer, what the processor has paid, Usually, in passing along any such expenses, the purchaser pays a little more at every step. a little more at every step.

The farmer probably earns what he gets, no matter how hard it comes on the consum-er, and as his income rises he spends money and improves general business, and the bene-fit may thus return to consumers as a class. Just the same, if this is a true picture,

an onlooker can't help wondering why the processors should be suling—why, if there must be suits against the tax, they are not brought by consumers.

ITALY'S PLANNED SUFFOCATION

A spokesman for Italy, seeking to justify his government's belligerent attitude, is quoted as saying, "The world seems to forget that Italy is literally suffocating. Our population is increasing yearly by 500,000. We must expand or perish, Ethiopia, with its undeveloped resources, offers the solution."

The argument of an expanding popula-tion is never a true justification for going to war, but it was used with better grace by Japan. In Nippon birth-control is encouraged, suicide is respected, and peaceful emi-gration is desired when foreign nations per-mit it. The Japanese have at least made sincere efforts to handle their overpopula-

tion problem by other means than conquest.

HUGE POWER CONSUMPTION

The increase in electric power production continues to be one of the remarkable fea-tures of business news. During the week of July 8 it amounted to one billion seven hundred seventy six million ten thousand kilo-watt-hours. That represented a gain not only over last year's figure but even over the corresponding week in the boom year, 1929.

One explanation given for the rise in power production is the increased use of mechan-idal refrigeration and the rapid development idal referigeration and the rapid development of air-conditioning. But those increases may meed explanation, too. There have been rate cuts in many communities, some forced and some yoluntary. 
