

The fact that four states have issued tokens in denominations of fractions of a cent, for the purpose of paying sales taxes, shows that in parts of the United States there is definite need for the proposed coinage of half-cents and mills.

The constitution expressly denies the states the right to coin money, assigning that function to Congress alone. But the fact that Congress has the sole right of coinage im-plies the duty to supply money in whatever form and denominations are needed.

There can be little doubt that the Treasury department is correct in its judgment that the state-issued tokens are actually money, and therefore illegal. But the federal gov-ernment can hardly criticize this usurpation of its power without offering to supply the need by the regular, legal method of national colnage.

It is true that the midget money has all the elements of a colossal nuisance, but it need not circulate except in states that have, through their tax laws, decided to tolerate the nuisance. The necessary legislation to permit the coinage should be accepted as a mere formality.
