#### THE ARTERIAL MARKET-ROAD

Governor Ross's contention that an eighty foot right of way, or maybe a sixty-foot right of way, is required for a thirty-foot highway sounds a little odd to those of us who have derived our ideas of the situation from look ing at the highways. But perhaps one of his two guesses about the government regulation is correct.

However, it does not sound as funny as his promise that all the market roads will have sixty-six foot rights of way. Twin Falls county has better use for its land than reserving wide strips at the edges of every road, as breeding grounds for weeds and white flies. The governor, realizing the po-litical importance of the topic, places an exaggerated emphasis on the market road pro-gram, completely forgetting that the farmers are among the principal users of the highways. The farmer, after being assured of a good, year 'round surface on his feeder road, next wants to be able to drive the rest of the way to town without constant danger of being crowded off the busy highway. The high-way is primarily an arterial market road, and only secondarily a transcontinental thoroughfare.

The immediate problem is how to widen the

highway. The only reason that has yet ap-peared in public for the inordinately wide right-of-way requirement is that it might be necessary for yet further widening in the future. In that case, perhaps it is unnecessary to go to the expense of moving fences, ditches, trees, etc., until the time comes when ditches, trees, etc., until the time comes when the full width is actually needed. Perhaps it is even unnecessary to actually buy the extra land immediately—options might serve the purpose. Perhaps the highway can be made safer and more nearly adequate by widening and improving the shoulders, without technically widening the actual highway. Perhaps the government regulations are not so iron bound as we have been given to believe.

There are many lines of study and investigation still open to us, and every new injury and death on the highway should drive us to greater determination.

#### BORAH FOR PRESIDENT

It is conceivable but not likely that Sonator-Borah will be a candidate for the Republican nomination for President next year. There are a good many reasons for this, chief among which is the attitude of Senator Borah among when is the actuator of senator format during many years towards any step which would in any manner serve to change his status in government. Senator Borah is probably perfectly willing to go on serving Idaho as Idaho's senior Senator but there never has been any evidence and there is none now that he would be willing to run for the Presidency or any other office or accept appointment to office of any kind.

And there is another reason. Senator Borah believes in the Constitution. He believes in its absolute inviolability. He has never missed an opportunity of defending it. never missed an opportunity of detending it. He is perhaps the best posted member of the entire Senate on the subject of the Constitution. And because of this fact Senator Borah is quite well aware that his candidacy would not be acceptable to a very distinct element within the party.


