DIRECT ACTION

The outbreak of lawlessness in California which resulted in an application of tar and feathers to two and the severe beating of three others is to be deplored but apparently a point is reached in dealing with agitators when no other form of treatment will suffice Certainly none has so thoroughly deterrent

an effect.

Perhaps the scenes enacted in Santa Rosa represented the only way out of an intolerable situation yet it is difficult to justify lawlessness of this character. Certainly it is to be hoped that there will be no repetition of the action taken. Respect for law is not heightened by such exhibitions no matter what the provocation.

There is no question but what organized efforts to feed the fires of discontent are going steadily on at different points throughoutthe country. Groups of men are hired and paid for their work and the more trouble they can sit up the more likely they are to hold their jobs. This sort of thing is throughly vicious and it is not at all supersigns, that vicious and it is not at all surprising tha direct action sometimes follows but carried to its logical conclusion such procedure would serve to undermine and discredit law and order and bring about a state of affairs which might be worse than the condition sought to be corrected. No one wants to see reign of wholesale lawlesaness vet ever sporadic cases of direct action point the way.

There need be little sympathy wasted on the victims of such outbreaks but there should be some better way of dealing with the evil. The doctrine that if the law doesn't protect us we will protect ourselves can only rarely be justified.

POPE ON WAR

If any sort of European war should eventuate as a result of the Italian-Ethiopian em-brogilo, declares Senator Pope of Idaho speaking in London a day or two ago, the United States would find itself involved. Moreover, such an outcome would be reason able and proper, the Senator added. While we are not involved in the present crisis and do not intend to be. Senator Pope declares we are "too involved in trade and other interests of a world wide nature" to keep out of a major conflict.

Such a view is somewhat disquieting, and Such a view is somewhat disquieting, and yet it may be that Senator Pope is perfectly right. History, he claims, shows that as a Nation we have entered every major European war where a maritime nation was engaged and if the African conflict spreads

as in nineteen hundred seventeen.

In other words, whether we desire it or not, any world conflagration will involve the United States.

whether we like it or not the stage is set for a general European war and the Italian-Ethiopian situation will probably be the spark which ignites the powder barrel. It is not a pleasant prospect.

THE NATIONAL INCOME

The national income gained five billion in the year nineteen thirty-four dollars in the year mineteen thirty-four. That's quite a little money. It's a gain of eleven per cent over the income of the pre-vious year. But it brings the income to a point only two-thirds of the way up to the national income of mineteen twenty-nine. Another gain of more than two billion, it is estimated, has been made in the first half of nineteen thirty-five, so this year will probably add at least as much as last year did. These gains are a little more than the na-tional treasury deficit of the same period. It isn't really gay to observe that all the

rains made by the people are counterbalanced by the deficit incurred by the government.
There are things we'd rather spend our extra money on than taxes. New dishes, for example, or sending a kid to college. But we had to face the deficit anyhow, and it is good to know that we carned enough extra

good to know that we earned enough extra in a year and a half to cover it.

These weighing and balancing considera-tions are only minor, after all. The real point is that the national income is gaining and apparently cannot be stopped from mounting for a while. Not everyone yet has felt the gain. But if a man's brother and son-in-law have jobs, at least he can live more comfortably on his own still small income than when he was trying to run three families on it. The gains here and there, spreading slowly, give everyone a lift of the

But being human, the chances are also that there would be plenty of long evenings when he would glady swap them all for a good, new Charlie






