Three is a degree of similarity, between the reply made by the Soviet to the recent American protest and the reply made a short time ago by the American state-department to a Japanese protest. The Soviet said that it could not assume any responsibility for the communist internationale which aims to overthrow all capitalistic so-cictios; the American government found it necessary to point out to the Japanese that it has no power to control the press and prevent caricatures of the Son of Heaven.

To Americans, the carricature incident seemed harmless though perhaps in bad taste, and the freedom of the press is well understood. Perhaps to Russians the speeches made at the internationale meeting at Moscow seem as trivial, and probably reasons of policy would make it very embarrassing to attempt to suppress the internationale.

It is true that Americans, when granting diplomatic recognition to Russia, understood things a little differently. We regarded the third internationale as being little else than an organ of the Soviet, and accorded recog nition because we believed that the Russian non-interference pledge would apply to that hody, which has been most distasteful to Americans. Perhaps we were deceived. But with so excellent an example before us

sut with so excellent an example perore is of the friction that may be caused between nations by nothing more serious than differences in tradition and manner of thought, it would be well for us to regard the Russian breach with tolerance and as much of understanding as possible. If there has been an actual offense, we should show our hand, but if there was nothing but a few stimm. but if there was nothing but a few stump speeches, just as we might have at home, the incident should be forgotten.






