

THE TOLL OF THE ROAD

Some day the American people may awak-eli to the fact that the toll of the road exact-a price in human life which is greater than

the Nation can afford.

Mrs. Ickes, wite of the Secretary of the Interior, is dead as a result of an auto accident. in New Mexico Saturday evening, probably originating-in-excessive-driving speed. On the same day a few hours later an old and respected resident of Twin Falls was struck down and killed within the City limits. Scarcely a day passes without a similar fatal-ity. These accidents, many of them unavoidable, are not confined to any one locality butare general over the country until the annual toll in killed and maimed has actually become heavier than the casualties among the Amer-ican fighting forces during the War.

It's a damning indictment.

Not all fast driving is careless driving and not all slow driving is safe driving. But there is too much of speed in the average motor car and an altogether too great a ten-dency on the part of all drivers to impute to all other drivers the same degree of driving all other drivers the same edge of uriving ability which they themselves posses. The man responsible for the little roadside signs in Yellowstone Park a few years ago which read. "Drive Carefully: You May Meet A-Fool", had the right idea. Reference was made to the type of driver who is unable or.

There are no dull statistics, merely a realistic account of what happens when two cars meet. The sheer horror of the scene which ensues is enough to tame the most reckless.

The fact of the matter is, auto driving is pecoming one of the most dangerous occupa tions in which anyone can indulge. War itself offers no greater risk to life and limb.

SAFER FORESTS

The CCC forestry work has had value beyoud the direct benefit done to the forests by planting, cleaning up and safeguarding, them from fires. It has done more perhaps than anything else ever did to persuado the nation of the value of its forest resources and instruct the public in taking care of

A good evidence of this benefit is found in the summer's record for forest fires. There, have been hardly any big disasters of this sort, and the small fires have been greatly nort, and the small lives have been greatly refuted. It isn't merely having more rain, either. Nor is it merely the direct protection given by the army of foresters. The public has been learning about-trees from them. The indirect effect of their instruction and labors is great.

People everywhere me coming to think in telms of tree preservation and to learn in tehms of tree preservation and to learn, and practice ordinary caution in this roods. It is coming to be the regularishing, instead of the exception, in most communities, for people, atarting fires among the trees, for plente og other purposes, to safeguard, then from deing blown by the wind and to just them out, completely before, leaving. This reform alone, in the long run, to a nation traditionally careless, of its natural wealth, might be worth more than the forestry resembled. might be worth more than the forestry lef employment has cost.


