



Harry Bridges, Australian import, who fine Italian hand is to be traced throughout the course of all the strikes and strike negotiations which have afflicted the ranks of the longshoremen from British Columbia to Southern California.

Now comes word of a threatened tie-up of shipping operations in New Orleans and it is safe to predict that in the forefront of the struggle, if it comes, will be found the redoubtable Bridges, auxious for the fight and willing to go to any known lengths to obtain for the strikers the things which he has succeeded in making them believe they should have.

One can sympathize with labor in its struggle for better wages and better working con-ditions without being utterly blinded to the rights-of every other element in the situation. A strike such as that threatened in New Orleans will entail a tremendous cost and the great bulk of this cost will fall heaviest, not upon labor or capital either but upon the public as a whole. Every line of business in New Orleans if not in all Louisiana will be affected. Every commercial activity will be curtailed. Every individual in whatever line will contribute in part to the cost which such a struggle is bound to entail.


