#### BRAVERY AT SEA

Seattravel, which received a very black eve in the disastrous burning of the Morro Castle, should find itself at last partially reinstated In public favor as a result of the experience of the Dixie in the recent Florida hurricane.

The passengers of the Dixie, aground dur-ing one of the worst storms in the experi-ence of seamen, had to undergo an extremely unpleasant experience. But not one was killed or seriously injured. And the same storm caused deaths estimated to number from two hundred seventy to one thousand to people on solid ground.

The traditional bravery and gallantry of a ship's officers and crew in time of emergency cast in doubt by the comportment of those in charge of the Morro Castle, was well exemplified by Captain Sundstrom of the Dixie and his subordinates.

At the same time that the rescue of the Dixle's passengers was being completed, two dangerous accidents to British ships on the other side of the Atlantic were being handled with similar efficiency, a total of eleven hundred passengers being saved without mishan.
