Through in Twin Falls Hears Townsend Plan Author Explain Aims

Dr. Francis E. Townsend, the man who gave us the role of a country doctor to found the Townsend revolving pension plan, predicted the downfall of political parties and the "return of America to a true democracy" before a gathering of approximately 600 persons assembled in Twin Falls city park last night. It was one of the largest crowds ever gathered in Twin Falls.

Dr. Townsend, founder of the Old Age Revolving Pension plan, who has Twin Falls again as his headquarters, declared that the people of over 60 years of age are in dire straits of retirement. He said that the government is liberally providing jobs for the younger men, putting more money into circulation, and that the government should provide for the aged.

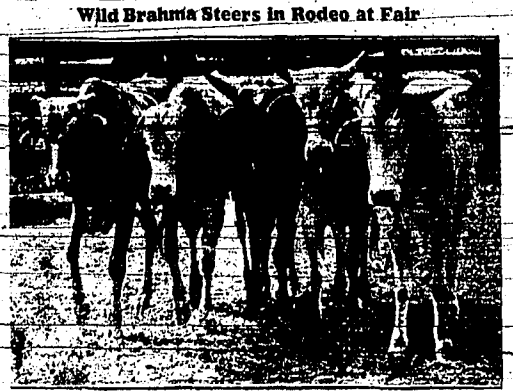
