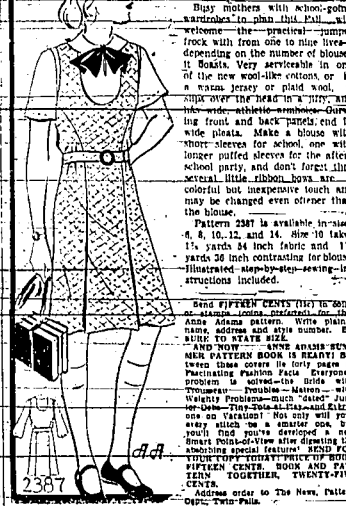

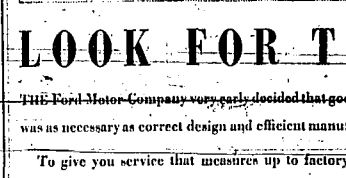

REVINATE FROM DANCING FALLS IN CZECH CAPITAL

PRAHA, Czechoslovakia (AP)—People in the Czechoslovak capital are not so much dancing as they were in 1924. Statistics produced by the "Prazer Press" show:

"During the amusement tax period up to 1924 which permit dancing as a business, the paper finds that the number of dances given by professional entertainers declined year by year. 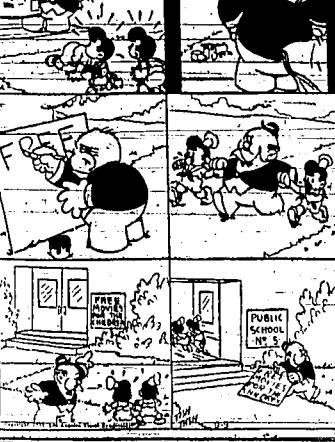
LINCOLN COUNTY AGENT TURNS IN RESIGNATION

Guiding Your Child

RESPONSIBILITY

Mary insisted that when she was left in charge of her younger brothers and sisters she felt like the "League of Nations." She was responsible for them, but had no way of enforcing her authority. Her parents did not permit her to punish any of the youngsters, but if anything went wrong in their absence, Mary was held to blame.

Probably they were right in forbidding Mary to administer justice. Children are apt to be too severe on each other, and Mary would have had to be a most exceptional child had she been able to manage the tribe with perfect equity and without taking advantage of her position of power.

This being the case, however, she should not have been left in charge as frequently as she was nor held to strictly to account for the behavior of the others. There come occasions in every family when some crisis arises which necessitates the absence of both parents. If there is no one to take their place, who can be called in, an older child who can be left in charge.

But such cases cannot and should not often be left to her. To not let her burden any child with responsibility ahead of time. Later she will, in all probability, have her own children to look after, and it seems hardly just that she should be forced to carry the load of motherhood ahead of time with none of its compensations.

If and when she must be left in charge, the younger children had better suffer a little mild adversity and possibly some injustice rather than leaving the older child helpless in the face of inaction.

It is a mistake to let a child take the reins of authority in some way, and make it very clear to the child that this is a temporary and respect the "vice-regent" in their parents' absence.

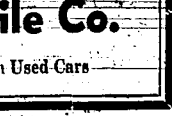
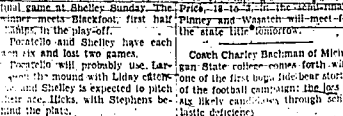
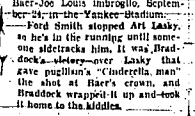
