It is interesting to speculate upon the political possibilities of the situation in ouisiana following the death of Senator Huev Pierce Long, Had Long lived it is easy Huey Pierce Long, Had Long lived it is easy to imagine that an enhanced prestige might easily have followed. From a press-agent standpoint it might have been possible to place the crown of martydom upon the head of the leader of the "Share the Wealth" movement and to have built by means of it a national programme which would have swept the country.

With the Senator removed from the field

of American politics enquiry turns naturally to the question as to whether or not a leader will be forthcoming who is capable of aswill be forthcoming who is capable of as-suming the Tong mantle either in Louislama or elsewhere. This seems more or less un-likely, Huey P. Long was in a class by him-self. Possessed of a degree of ability which has often been underestimated he was also endowed with courage of a high order and the repeated onalaughts of his enemics were naver able to shake it. He must have been conscious of the fact that the machine which he built could not forever survive yet there was never any evidence of weakening, and no least sign of a willingness to compromise

with anybody.

London newapapers made much of the assassination. "The most baffling, bizarre chaggeter in American politics" were the words used by one-daily-to-describe-Long. The London "Evening Standard" said editorially: "Perhaps-Long was more frequentially the charged with corrunt practices than any torially: "Perings Long was more requestly charged with corrupt practices than any other man of our time. In his own State he castallished—a—dictatorship—by—methods—not known to Mussolini on Hiller." Another commentator wrote: "Outside of Louisiana. commentator. wrote: "Gutside of Louisians, the world has a distorted view of the King-fish. He is remarkably intelligent: There is no more talented lawyer in the United States. If he lives he will win the sympathy which accrues to every political martyr."

is impossible to condone his murder or sympathize with his assassin.






