

It seems pretty arbitrary, at first blush, when General Johnson and Mayor La Guardia tell men on relief to take federal relief jobs or go to jail. But the ultimatur effective: And on second thought it seems fair, as long as it is enforced with due regard to exceptional cases.

Every citizen ought to be clear-minded

The workers have been supported by fed-eral and local funds. Such support, a novelty in American life, was started in a crisis to tide over the unemployed until private em-ployment becomes available again. The present arrangement is a half-way policy, spend-ing public funds for work instead of giving it for nothing. It is to be stopped as private Jobs become available. Meanwhile the author-tics in charge of the public funds must de-termine the conditions under which the money is paid.

This is an alternative to a permanent dole r millions of families. Under such conditions, if able-bodied me

will not take the proffered jobs for the money vailable to pay them, it would not be un-air to prosecute them for "failure to sup-ort their families." Fortunately nearly all heneficiaries concerned have enough self-respect, or enough sense, so that the more threat drives them to accept the prof-fered jobs and going off the dole.

This is not really "forced labor", as some objectors maintain. It is merely refusal to tolerate fraud against the government, throw-away-taxpayers' money and engage in wholesale-corruption-of the morale-of American workmen. -






