Joseph Cassiopee, French meteorologist, has spent fifteen years studying weather cycles, and believes he has discovered the vay to make exact predictions of the weather a given locality and season

He starts with the theory that there is a definite relationship between eclipses and other heavenly phenomena and such things as earthquakes, storms, rains, and so on 1f, therefore, one could find a previous year in which the same lunar and solar movements occurred as will occur, for instance, in 1936, he presumption is that the weather of the early year will be duplicated in the one com-

He finds that the same eclipses occur on

the same days of the year (making sullable-adjustments for calendar changes), at inter-yals of three hundred seventy-two years.

Basing his predictions on all available in-formation about weather in that region three hundred seventy-two years ago, M.
