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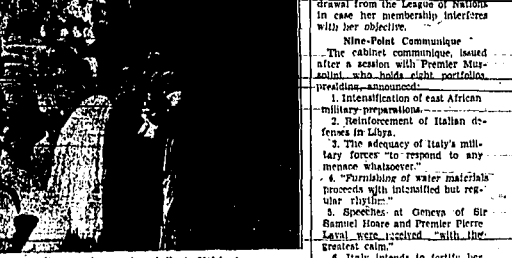

SINGER'S PRINTS FOUND ON PISTOL

Father of Dead Girl Discovers Prints From Theory of Suicide

WEST CHESTER, Pa., Sept. 14 (AP)—A brilliant report that the fingerprints of Miss Evelyn Fryer were found on the pistol that blasted her life strengthened the theory that the diminutive "Black Beauty" coach driver was guilty of her death.

Charles Dunlap, expert of the Chester, Pennsylvania, police department, announced after an examination that two finger prints were found on the lethal weapon and that both of them were those of the actress.

After receiving Dunlap's report, a Chester police investigation continued, at least until a coroner's inquest was held on the body.

Officers Handle Gun Coroner's inquest on Sept. 14, 1935, at Chester, Pa., was held to determine the cause of death of Miss Evelyn Fryer.

It was reported that the actress had been in the city for some time and that she had been seen in the neighborhood of the fatal shooting.

The coroner's jury returned a verdict of suicide, based on the evidence presented at the inquest.

The father of the dead girl, Mr. J. E. Fryer, is reported to be in a state of deep grief and is being comforted by friends and neighbors.

A government spokesman, commenting on the importance of the cabinet committee, said tonight that the government's military and naval preparations should not be minimized.

Frontiers are guarded, he asserted. An official source said "Italy does not want to see the League of Nations disintegrated."
