FEDERAL AUTHORITY IN COLUMBIA BASIN MEETS OPPOSITION

Secretary of Idaho Chamber of Commerce Declares State Not in Favor of Government's Proposal

(By The Associated Press) BOISE, Sept. 16 — L. F. Parsons, secretary of the Idaho state chamber of commerce, declares here today that Idaho is in favor of setting up a federal authority to take charge of developing the Columbia River basin. He made his statement to a group of 100 prominent Idaho officials and industrial leaders gathered here for a meeting called by Marshall H. Dana of Portland, Oregon, chairman of the national planning commission.

The purpose of the hearing which got under way this afternoon, it was explained by Dana, is to obtain the views of Idaho in connection with the authority to be set up to promote and regulate development of the basin, which includes a part of Idaho.

Growing Federal Dominance — Speaking from personal observations and contact and not in behalf of the state chamber, Parsons noted that Idaho has 2,000,000 acres of land within its borders.

"But 70 per cent of that, or 37,000,000 acres of it, already is under the control of the federal government, leaving only 16,000,000 actually under the state government," he noted.

"Through the passage of the national grazing act, millions of acres of land recently were added to the millions in national forests, and I feel that Idaho people generally are hesitant to accept a plan that might mean the transfer of more of our acres to the control of the federal government."

"The farmers of Idaho have opposed the plan, or more land under irrigation, until such a time as their present production can be increased to the point where they can and they look with some disfavour upon giant reclamation projects which they fear would take away their land."

HITLER FORECASTS DEMOCRACY'S DOOM

Address Delivered Following Elaborate Display of Military Power

(By The Associated Press) NURNBERG, Sept. 16 (AP) — Hitler predicted the doom of democracy in a rousing address tonight at the annual convention of the Nazi party in Nuremberg.

"Thousands of Dr. Fuehrer's followers," Hitler said, "will be present for the first time since Germany broke with the Versailles treaty an exhibition of the nation's new military power, cheered his statements."

"Hitler told his listeners: 'The fact that they rest on democracy is not an excuse for their cowardice and their lack of principle are wrong, but rather that historical processes take place.'"

"Wild applause greeted this assertion, 'Hitler announced the supremacy of the party over state officials, saying, 'Our party must make decisions in the future, not the state officials, in accordance with party principles, and demanded unhesitating obedience from his followers.'"

League Members Talk Boycott Against Italy

Russia, Poland Clash At Geneva Sessions Seeking Way to Avert War

(By The Associated Press) GENEVA, Sept. 16 — League of Nations members seeking a way to keep Mussolini from war, were reported from reliable sources tonight to have gone to work on a preliminary plan for a "protective" economic boycott of Italy if the should launch unprovoked hostilities in Ethiopia.

The disclosure came as the league assembly convened today for a general debate marked by repeated expressions of fidelity to the league covenant and a diplomatic brush between Soviet Russia and Poland during which the Polish delegates walked out on a speech by Maxim Litvinoff, the Russian foreign commissar.

Those who professed to be close to the league commissar's plans insisted that this "protective" boycott would not be considered tantamount to an economic blockade.

"They explained that the word 'boycott' immediately conjures up the image of a blockade, and the employment of such a word is unnecessary, but for the moment the fundamental idea is a self-defensive economic measure which would not wedge themselves to have no economic relations with Italy."

The British delegation, asked this evening about the boycott, reported that the league had authorized the following statement:

"The British and French governments have had time to time to consider the possibility of a boycott of Italy in the event of certain things happening. But the British government has made no definite proposals."

Thinking of Future — The British and French governments added, however, that they might be able to do more in the future and there has been general discussion by the league members as to how they might be able to do more in the future.

It was reported in league circles that a general boycott against Italy might be the only way to prove most embarrassing for that country because of Italy's need for obtaining raw materials from abroad.

Diplomats close to the situation said, moreover, that Great Britain would keep the British fleet in the Mediterranean to deter Italy from any possible league measures as long as possible and to limit collection of any possible league measures.

The members then would undertake to subject Italy to economic sanctions, and the league members agreed to mutually support each other in any such economic measures undertaken.

Three small nations, Panama, Haiti and Cuba, were reported to have sent their representatives to plead for peace through the league council.

KIMBERLY TO VOTE ON WATER BONDS

Trustees in recessed session Set Date for Election

KIMBERLY, Sept. 16 - Kimberly's municipal trustees in recessed session this evening set October 22, next, as the date of the election at which Kimberly's taxpayers are to vote on a proposed \$750,000 bond issue to match an approved PWA grant of \$250,000 for construction of a \$500,000 waterworks system, including wells, storage tank and distribution system.

The federal grant of 45 per cent of the total cost of the proposed waterworks system was recently announced, following application made almost a year ago. Municipal officials have been given to understand that the improvement is favored by an overwhelming majority of the town's residents.

Kimberly's water supply now is derived from a number of privately owned wells and there is no distribution system. Registration for the bond election is to be at the office of the clerk, Cecil Ridgeway, up to and including the Saturday before the election. Only qualified electors who are taxpayers of Kimberly and who are registered, are entitled to vote at this election.

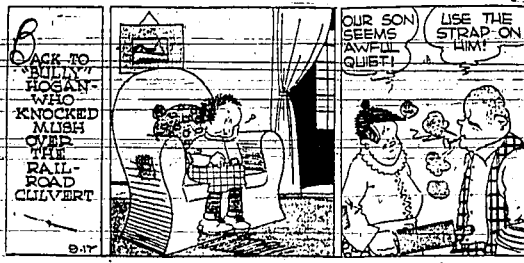

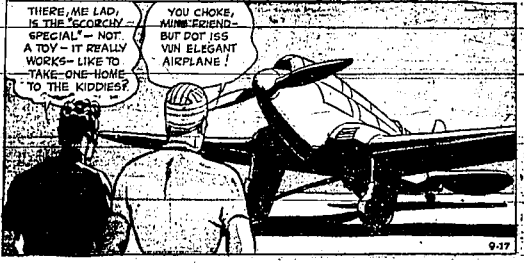

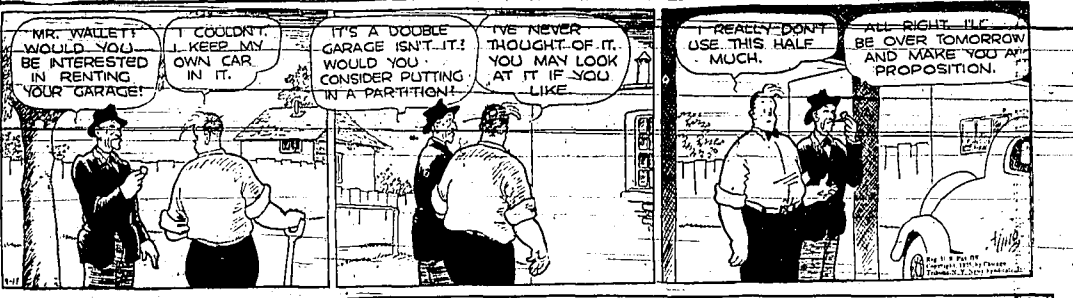
