Eyston completed a day and night run against time across the salt flats of northwestern Utah. His average speed was in excess of 140 miles per hour. The former record, held by Al Jenkins of Salt Lake City, was 135.47 miles per hour.

In the many speeches made yesterday in observance of Constitution day, one central idea stands out. The Constitution, the supreme law and the basic plan of the United States, may be changed, but only by the method of amendment set forth in the document itself.

Congress has no power to change the Constitution; neither does the Supreme Court. Only the States, the ultimately highest power in the nation, have that right. Congress may initiate amendments, and the Supreme Court, in interpreting the flexible charter, can determine its meaning within the limits of honest differences of opinion.

The method of amendment has been criticized for being difficult and time consuming. But when one considers the follies that might be placed in the Constitution by the waves of strong, irrational feeling to which any nation is subject, it appears that one of the wisest provisions in that remarkably wise document is the provision that makes amendment impossible without a widespread majority in favor of the change.

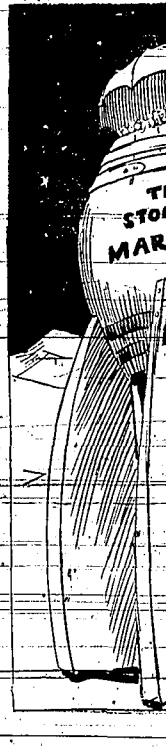

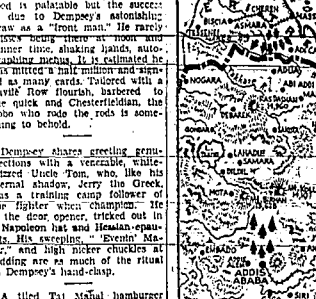


Doric Passengers Rescued

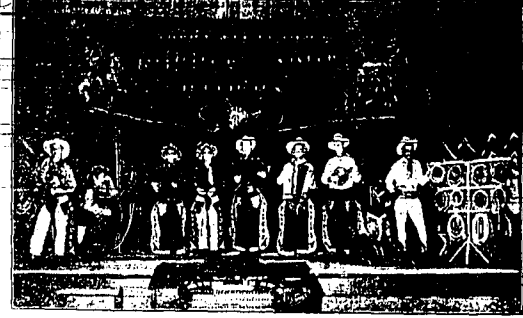

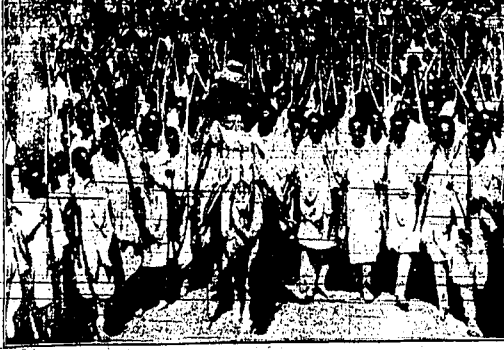
