THE CONSTITUTION

In the many speeches made yesterday in bservance of Constitution day, one central stands out. The Constitution, the sulaw and the basic plan of the United States, may be changed, but only by the method of amendment set forth in the document itself.

ment itself.

Congress has no power to change the Constitution: Neither does the Supreme Court.

Only the States, the ultimately highest power in the nation, have that right. Congress may initiate amendments, and the Supreme Court, in interpreting the flexible charter, can determine its meaning within the limits honest differences of opinion. But for eith body to go farther, and neglect or porvert were in the best interests of the nation, would be a usurpation of power and a criminal violation of law.

The method of amendment has been criticized for being difficult and time consuming. But—when one-considers—the-follies—that night be placed in the Constitution by the waves of strong, irrational feeling to which any nation is subject, it appears that one of the wisest provisions—in—that remarkably wise document is the provision that makes amendment impossible without a widespread majority in favor of the change (in at least three-fourths of the states), and without The method of amendment has been critithree-fourths of the states), and without sufficient time to give the people opportun-ity to make a caroful and studied decision.

- CARD-INDEXED CENSUS-

The citizens of the United States are about to be card-indexed by the Census Bureau as a preliminary step in the operation of the social security-law. Herotofore census records have classified information geograph leally rather than alphabetically. But with people applying for benefits under the new law, it will be necessary to have proof of quickly accessible. That means the good card index with its alphabetical ar-

The 1900 census will be the basis for the new files. That is the only census to date showing both the year and the month of birth of all individuals. New names will be added in the future as new censuses discover

inem.

It is a huge task which will take a year
to complete. A nucleus staff from the census
bureau will direct the work, which will employ three thousand white-collar, Works-Progress beneficiaries.

We have been accustomed to census-taking

and the Interesting statistics which proceed from every new census. Card-indexing, on the other hand, sounds a little unpleasant to the average American. He'll have to get used to the fact that it is essential to social security payments and that it has nothing in common with police surveillance such as some foreign countries have.


