The news that no contamination of any The news that no contamination or any kind exists in the Twin Falls City water supply—should be haled with thanksgiving by Twin Falls people. At the same time the City is in no sense immuno from the danger of infection from other sources and, in the circumstances, prompt measures are point-edly called for as a means of combatting what might very well develop into an epi-demic of typhoid of no mean proportions.

To date there are a number of cases of typhoid fever. For the most part these appear to have originated in the territory surrounding Twin Falls, Certain sources of water supply other than the City supply have been found to be contaminated and if a spread of the disease is to be provented the situa-

tion must be corrected.

Steps have already been taken looking to this end and upon the basis of known facts there appears to be little cause for uncasiness as to the outcome.

POTATO CONTROL

All potatoes harvested after December first, 1935, and sold in the United States shall be packed in closed and marked containers to which shall be attached tax stamps or exemption stamps. That applies to the "first sale' that is, the original sale made by the farmer

The farmer, it will be observed, is subjected to two requirements. First, the po-tatoes must-be packed in containers prescribed by the government. Second, each container must bear a government stamp, similar to the familiar revenue stamp on

Any person who knowingly sells or offers for sale, or knowingly offers to buy, or buys, potatoes not packed as required by this file.

or any person who knowingly offers to buy or any person who knowingly offers to buy or buys potatoes to the package of which are not affixed stamps, shall upon conviction thereof, be fined not more than one thousand dollars. Any person convicted of a second offense may in addition to such fine, be imprisoned for not more than one year. Only those who raise and sell less than five laughter of a second. bushels are exempt.




